

PREBLE MEN HOLD PIG SALE; HESSIAN FLY RUINS CROPS

Eaton, Oct. 27.—Twenty head of thoroughbred pigs, mostly spring boars and gilts of the Spotted Poland, Berkshire and Big Type Poland breeds, were sold at the first public sale held by the Preble County Pure-Bred Livestock association, on the county fairgrounds. Total sales amounted to \$36.50 a head, or an average of \$32.50 a head. All stock sold at the sale is eligible to register.

Jesse L. Haston contributed 9 head of Spotted Polands to the sale; J. W. Daffin, 4 head of Berkshires; Jesse Johnson, 4 head of Big Type Polands, and Trunk Bros., Wilbur Christman and J. S. Niswander, one head each of Big Type Poland. Auctioneer Bart Foley, Seven Mile, cried the sale.

The association is laying plans for a big cattle, horse and hog sale next spring.

Hessian Fly Loose
Hessian fly is ravaging growing wheat in some sections of Preble county, according to County Agricultural Agent A. J. Swift. He says the pest is worst in early-sown wheat. His inspection up to this time has been confined to the eastern section of the county, where he says the fly is so extensive in some fields that the wheat is practically worthless and likely will be plowed under.

On one stock of wheat Agent Swift says he found 24 specimens of the pest. He expects to visit all sections of the county just as soon as possible to ascertain to what extent the entire county is affected by the fly.
