WAGNER GRAIN LETTER

CHICAGO, Feb. 14.—The ten to twelve cent cash corn rise this week has made the cash buyer very conservative and cars are lacking for shipment to the east. No. 4 mixed corn around \$1.41 compared with \$1.31 a few days ago. Cash corn one to three cents lower. No export demand at the seaboard. We do not consider the three million rye and three million oats export sales of the last three days as extraordinary. Locals are afraid to press grain sales. Chicago is not offering much grain to the east. Over Monday the attitude of the cash corn buyer will prevent any particular rise. Realizing on the bulges is indicated.
