## WAGNER GRAIN LETTER

CHICAGO, Feb. 18.—Sentiment mainly bearish but only small receipts in corn are expected. The priority car order expires at midnight tonight but the run during the past 10 days has been very disappointing. The far eastern roads will likely grant permission to ship grain to New York. Dullness of export demand and reselling of oats along with the sales of some Argentine corn to New York below United States prices, suggests another drop on Thursday. Washington demand for easier food prices and packing house talk of a serious drain on export outlooks for provisions, create much talk. Sales apparently are due on any closing bulge, though a long break can be doubted.
