

## SLICK RELIEVED OF TRASH WORK; LIGHT LAW IS OPPOSED

Council Monday night relieved F. E. Slick, trash contractor, of the trash contract, on suspension of the rules.

The offer of Slick takes effect immediately, although the contract will not terminate for at least two weeks. Slick will lend the city practically all of his entire cleaning equipment with men, to go over the city and have it in as good a shape as it was when he took the contract. This will all be done without compensation on Slick's part.

Al Schneider, street commissioner, may be placed in charge of the trash when the city takes the contract.

It was emphatically stated that no ordinance for daylight saving would be introduced this spring, at last night's session. Some confusion as to whom the matter had been referred to at the last session, came up Monday night, city attorney Robbins saying he thought it had been referred to the ordinance committee and the ordinance committee saying they understood that he was to frame it.

"There is no use giving it to me to draw up," said Robbins, "because I am against it."

Several city officials stated that the daylight saving ordinance would never be introduced.

### Expert for Light Plant

Unanimous approval was given the ordinance appropriating \$500 for the services of an expert accountant to go over the books, and the entire booking system of the city light plant for the past five years.

It is understood that the city officials desire the accountant to prepare a detailed statement for the past five years for submission to the public service commission, in an attempt to get a larger valuation on the city plant.

At present it has been appraised at \$750,000 when it is worth a million dollars. With a larger valuation, it is understood, that a larger depreciation fund will be sought.

The present 3 per cent depreciation is in books account only, while if a larger one is secured the money will be put aside for the purpose of saving for expenditures for new machinery for the plant.

Council ratified the ordinance on suspension of the rules.
