Great Britain's foreign representatives as well as our own have had their troubles, it seems, over the matter of remuneration, though the difficulties are not quite of the same character. Heretofore, for example, it has been the custom to pay the ambassador to this country a salary of £10,000, this amount to cover expenses of entertainment, which usually mean a good deal in diplomatic life. This was a liberal enough sum in the days of a lower cost of living and when income taxes were not heavy. British income taxes are now high and the complaint is that they eat up a salary. Also the cost of living affects official salaries like any others.


Then from forty on, you will be worth while in the world and to yourself.


