

EARLHAM IN LIST OF STATE COLLEGES IN CHURCH DRIVE

Earlham college, with the inter-church world movement budget of \$883,000, is one of 11 denominational colleges and universities of the state included in the general budget of the movement allied in training 100,000 additional recruits for life service during the next five years, says an announcement made at the national inter-church world movement headquarters in New York.

A survey conducted by Dr. Robert L. Kelly, formerly president of Earlham, now director of the American education department of the inter-church world movement, disclosed the fact that the denominational institutions have produced 90 per cent of the ministers and missionaries in home and foreign service.

According to reports from the presidents of the Indiana institutions, the sum asked for educational purposes amounts to more than \$13,000,000, and covers a five year program that will increase the efficiency of the colleges through adequately equipped buildings and endowment funds.

Many Colleges Included.
The colleges included in the denominational budgets are as follows:
Butler college, Indianapolis, Disciples of Christ, \$3,500,000; Fairmount academy, Fairmount, Friends, \$35,000; Franklin college, Franklin, Northern Baptist convention, \$1,225,000; Hanover college, Hanover, at one time under the control of the Presbyterian church, but now an interdenominational college, \$500,000; Indiana Central university, Indianapolis, United Brethren, \$2,000,000; Indiana School of Religion, Bloomington, \$450,000; Manchester college, North Manchester, Church of the Brethren, \$1,000,000; Oakland City college, General Baptists, \$1,020,000; Earlham college, Richmond, Friends, \$883,000; Union Christian college, Merton, Christian, \$550,000; Wabash college, Crawfordsville, affiliated with the Presbyterian church, but not directly under its control, \$2,000,000.

American Legion

Arthur Woods, chairman of the National Americanization commission of the American legion, issued a statement yesterday in which he declared that the reported plan of "reds" to obtain membership in the legion for the purpose of spying upon it, would cause no real harm.

His statement, which was issued from the national headquarters of the legion, said that good might come from the scheme, since the "reds" might be converted to a belief in law and order by learning something of the work of the legion.

"We welcome into the legion all sorts and conditions of men; the only belief we insist upon is the belief in Americanism," said Mr. Woods. "The legion has no concern with political parties or with industrial, economic or social theories, so long as they are consistent with the principles of Americanism."

No Real Harm Possible.
"The American legion is against those who are against America, whether they be external or internal enemies. If enemies of America become members of the legion, they do so only after falsely subscribing to the legion's declaration of principles."

"No real harm, however, can be done to the legion or its work of promoting Americanism by the presence in its membership of such persons. We are working to promote public welfare and good citizenship, and the more they find out about this work the better. It will do them good."

"They will find it every difficult."

BETTER RATES IN NORTHWEST ASKED

The Indiana Public Service Commission and the Indiana Chamber of Commerce have filed before the Interstate Commerce Commission a petition for a readjustment of the class freight rates in the Northwestern territory which are discriminatory to Indiana shippers.

O. P. Gohlth, chief of the traffic bureau of the Indiana Commission, said that under the present rates Illinois shippers obtain lower rates from points in Illinois to points in the Northwest than can be obtained by Indiana shippers.

He said that the commission and the State Chamber of Commerce will make a fight to obtain a reduction in Indiana rates to the Northwest instead of seeking to increase the Illinois rates and bring them to a parity with the Hoosier class freight rates.

Forty-one railroads are named as defendants in the petition. It is pointed out that all the roads maintain class freight rates from points in Illinois (including west bank of the Mississippi River and points in Missouri and Iowa) to St. Paul and Minneapolis, and that are relatively lower than the rates from Indiana points to the same destinations.

FLU AND PNEUMONIA TAKE 2,458 LIVES IN FEBRUARY
The toll of lives lost in Indiana as a result of influenza and pneumonia during the month of February was 2,458, or 1,478 in excess of the number of deaths from those causes in February, 1919, figures compiled by the state board of health show. The normal number of deaths from influenza and pneumonia for February, is less than 600.

WANTS REAL PARTY MAN FOR PRESIDENT
WASHINGTON March 22.—Edward G. Hoffman, Democratic national committeeman from Indiana, expressed the belief here Saturday that there is a constantly growing sentiment in favor of choosing a real, Simon-pure Democrat like Vice President Marshall for the presidential nomination. Mr. Hoffman said that the Vice President will not seek the nomination, but that this will not prevent the Democratic delegates from seeking Mr. Marshall.
