

WAYNE INTERCHURCH MEETING ONE OF 4; FINANCE MEN MEET

The Interchurch World Movement county conference in Wayne county will include three sessions on April 6, at the Reid Memorial church. The opening session is at 10:30 a. m., the afternoon session opens at 3 o'clock, and the evening session at 7:30.

In addition to these three general conference sessions there are to be denominational and young people's rallies. These rallies probably will be held the dinner or supper hours. The general conference sessions are to be held at the Reid Memorial church and it is probable that the denominational gatherings and young people's rally will be held at the Y. M. C. A. or other city churches.

Four Coming Conferences.

Additional information regarding the conference plans were received Thursday from Indianapolis.

The state field department of the Interchurch World movement is to send out teams of workers to direct these county conferences.

The Wayne county conference in Richmond on April 6 is to be followed on succeeding days by similar county conferences in Union, Fayette and Franklin counties in charge of the same conference team. The state has been divided into 22 districts with plans for four county conferences in each district.

The four fold program of the field

department of the world movement is to be presented at these conferences, as also is the survey work and the financial campaign plans.


