

THREE GOLD STARS SHINE ON SERVICE FLAG OF WASHINGTON

Three gold star names are on the Washington township roll of honor, information for which was gathered by Lincoln Parkins, of Milton. A large number of men have not sent in information on their activities during the war, and the county committee urges them to do so.

GOLD STAR ROLL OF HONOR.
Raymond Bryant, who died of influenza at Camp Greenleaf, Ga., Oct. 19, 1918, was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Greenberry Bryant, of Milton, Indiana. He entered the service March 6, 1918, and was assigned to medical department. On April 11, 1918, was promoted to sergeant.

Ralph H. Moore, son of Jesse E. and Malinda Moore, was killed in action October 8, 1918, in France. He entered the service June, 1917, at Detroit, Mich., and was assigned to the 12th company, Machine Gun battalion medical department. On April 11, 1918, was promoted to sergeant.

Henry Heath Callaway, son of Robert F. Callaway, died at Camp Eustis, Virginia, Oct. 10, 1918, of influenza. He entered the service June 1, 1918, and was assigned to coast artillery.

WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP
Lester Clayton Knipp entered the service Sept. 20, 1917, and was assigned to Company M, 161st Infantry, 38th Division; embarked from Montreal, Canada, Oct. 4, 1918, and arrived in Liverpool, England, Oct. 18, 1918; sailed for United States May 19, 1919, arriving in Newport News, Va., May 20, 1919, and discharged June 2, 1919, as corporal.

Clarence Underwood Knipp entered the service March 6, 1918, and was assigned to Field Hospital, Medical Branch, National Army; embarked from Hoboken, N. J., June 8, 1918, and arrived at Liverpool, June 15, 1918; sailed for United States June 10, 1919, and arrived in Hoboken, N. J., June 18, 1919; discharged June 25, 1919.

Was in Many Hospitals.
Jonathan Lyoid Parkind entered the service June 1, 1917, at Indianapolis, as Hospital Apprentice, second class; assigned to Hospital Corp Training School at Great Lakes Naval Training Station, Great Lakes, Ill.; other service in United States at Marine Barracks, Quantico, Va., U. S. N. Hospital, Washington, D. C.; discharged August 4, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Ivan Worth Parkins entered the service July 21, 1917, and was assigned to Company A, 36th Regiment, Infantry, Regular Army; discharged April 22, 1919, second lieutenant, Medical Captaincy.

William Culter Squier entered the service June 15, 1918, and was commissioned captain, Medical Corps, Regular Army; assigned to Camp Greenleaf, Chickamauga Park, Ga.; U. S. Army Hospital 36, Detroit, Mich., and Ft. Russell, Wyoming; tentatively discharged June 30, 1920.

Francis Nelson Hester entered the service Dec. 1, 1917, and was assigned to 328th Aero Squadron Aviation Section, Signal Corps; embarked from New York Sept. 1, 1918, and arrived at Glasgow, Scotland, Sept. 13, 1918; arrived back in United States Sept. 5, 1919, and was discharged Sept. 12, 1919, as sergeant.

Isaac Russell Bryant entered the service March 6, 1918, and was assigned to Field Hospital, Medical Branch, Regular Army; embarked from New York June 8, 1918, and arrived in Liverpool, England, June 15, 1918; sailed for United States May 28, 1919, arriving in Boston, Mass., June 9, 1919; discharged June 21, 1919.

Earl Clayton Clingman entered the service May 17, 1918, and was assigned


