

RICHMOND'S CENSUS ONLY ONE IN STATE ANNOUNCED IN WEEK

WASHINGTON, March 29.—Seventy-one cities, including Richmond, Ind., learned the past week just how big they are. Some showed a bare gain, while two or three cities boast of an increase in population for the past decade as high as 144 per cent.

Richmond's new population figure is 26,728, a gain of 19.7 per cent for the past ten years. It is interesting to note that Richmond's gain between 1910 and 1920 is almost the same as its gain between 1900 and 1910. The city's net gain in men, women and children for the past decade is 4,404, while the gain for the preceding decade was 4,098. Richmond, while its increase is steady rather than sensational, is known as one of Indiana's most substantial cities.

Just why people should flock to Brighton, Ala., or Warren, O., is not explained, but each of these cities shows a gain for the decade of 144 per cent. The population figures for the past week follow:

A certain, even though limited, amount of home building must and will be done in every community, irrespective of the increased cost of materials and labor. The incessant and peremptory demand for homes makes this necessary.

If everything was cheap, or even normally so, and had been for several years, there would not be the present scarcity of houses, because the supply would have kept pace with the demand. The problem can not be successfully and economically solved in a month, nor in one season.

In no line of activity can the accumulated non-production of four or five years be overcome in one year by any reasonable make-shift whatever. To face the problem as it stands, and make up for the non-production as rapidly, economically and scientifically as possible is the only answer.

The man who can afford only a cheap house, can not build under present conditions, but that class of men who are earning more than formerly can afford to build, and the home he vacates houses another family immediately, and so on, automatically, all down the line.

There will be home-building in Richmond this season and next, as there will be elsewhere.

Resigns as Head

BY reason of failing health, Dr. Edmund J. James has resigned as president of the University of Illinois. "I have wept useless tears at having to give up, but it is of no use," wrote Dr. James in tendering his resignation. "I cannot go on and do justice to the institution."

Dr. James, who has been the only native Illinoisan to head the institution, has been president of the University of Illinois for 14 years. He was the fourth to hold the office and succeeded Andrew S. Draper. During his period of service he has seen the annual enrollment increase from 3,000 to approximately 9,000. He was born in Jacksonville, Ill., on May 21, 1855. During his educational career he held positions at Evanston High School, Model High School, Normal, Ill.; Wharton School of Finance and Economy, University of Pennsylvania, University of Chicago, and Northwestern from 1902 to 1904 and was appointed head of the University of Illinois in 1905.

When the United States entered the war in 1917 he offered the facilities of the university to the government. He directed the establishment of schools for the manufacture of warfare chemicals and military aeronautics of the university's S. A. T. C., which had an enrollment of 3,023.
