

BERGDOLL GETS 5 YEARS IN PRISON

NEW YORK, March 31. — Grover Cleveland Bergdoll, wealthy young Philadelphia draft evader, Tuesday was sentenced to serve a term of five years imprisonment at hard labor at the United States disciplinary barracks on Governor's Island, New York Harbor.

Bergdoll, who for almost two years eluded the government agents during the world war, and who was tried by a military court-martial for desertion under the 53rd article of war, also was sentenced "to be discharged dishonorably from the United States army, and to forfeit all pay and allowances due and to become due."

The findings of the court were approved by Lieutenant General Robert Lee Bullard, as commander of the eastern department.

He designated Governor's Island to be the place of confinement and decreed that the sentence be begun immediately.

Bergdoll was found to be guilty of desertion from August 8, 1918, when he failed to report for duty under the selective service law. He was arrested at his home in Philadelphia January 7.

Reid Hospital to Offer Special Nurses' School; List of Patients Larger


