

CITY'S BOYS WENT UP RAPIDLY IN THE A. E. F. SERVICES

Herbert Milton Cotton entered the service Aug. 27, 1917, Officers' Training Camp, Ft. Benjamin Harrison, Indianapolis, Ind.; commissioned second lieutenant, June 27, 1918; assigned to Company D, 342nd M. G. Battalion, 89th Division; entered from New York June 1, 1918, and arrived in Liverpool, England, about June 10, 1918; battles, held Lucy Sector, St. Mihiel drive, Eysan sector, and Meuse-Argonne drive; slightly gassed; sailed for United States latter part of May, 1919; arrived May 27, 1919; discharged June 9, 1919.

Lawrence Edward Gausepohl entered the service and was commissioned first lieutenant M. R. C. Officers' Reserve; embarked from Hoboken, N. J., August, 1918, and arrived in Brest, France, Sept. 2, 1918; served at Fifth Depot Area and First Depot Area, France, September and October, 1918; transferred to Fourth Division, 16th F. A., regular army, while in Argonne, Nov. 19 to Dec. 12; enroute to Germany Dec. 12, 1918, to June 21, 1919, Fourth Division, Acre Eifel, Prussian Rhineland; sailed for United States, June 26, 1919, and arrived Hoboken, N. J., July 4, 1919; discharged July 10, 1919; captain, M. C.

Albert Elden Hill entered the service January, 1918, and was assigned to M. S. T. U. No. 380, regular army, Ft. Thomas, Ky.; Camp Moggs, D. C.; Camp Holabird, Md.; Camp Eustis, Va.; discharged Dec. 23, 1918, Camp Eustis, Virginia; sergeant, first class.

Curtis Duncan entered the service Aug. 4, 1918, and was assigned to Company K, Eighth Pioneers, 95th Division, infantry, National army, Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, O.; discharged Dec. 17, 1918.

Did Experimental Work
Elwood Shutz entered the service Dec. 13, 1917, and was assigned to 55th Balloon Company, Aviation Corps, Regular Army, Ft. Thomas, Ky., and Omaha, Neb.; was assigned to special duty at Ft. Omaha, Neb., doing experimental work on propaganda balloons and gas guns for camouflage; discharged Dec. 23, 1918; corporal.

Albert Clayton Jordan entered the service July 24, 1918, and was assigned to 45th Company, 12th Battalion, 159th D. B.; transferred from above company to Personnel Department, Camp Headquarters Detachment, September 8, 1918; discharged Jan. 31, 1920.

Carl Gordon Asbury entered the service May 18, 1918, as apprentice seaman, and after training at Great Lakes Training Station for three weeks was sent to France and assigned to mine sweeping forces in North Sea aboard U. S. S. Widgdon; discharged Dec. 13, 1919, Charleston, S. C.

Almond Leon Thompson entered the service June 24, 1918, as private

and was assigned to Company E, 34th Engineers, National Guards; arrived at Brest, France, Oct. 18, 1918; trained in France; sailed for United States June 5, 1919, and arrived in New York June 16, 1919; discharged Dec. 13, 1919; mechanic.

Spent Time on Imperator.

Lester L. Surface entered the service July 17, 1917, as seaman 3-C and trained at Great Lakes Naval Station, Philadelphia Navy Yards, embarked from New York and arrived in Bordeaux, France; upon arrival in France was transferred to shore duty in post office at Bordeaux, and remained there until Imperator was put into commission; was on this ship at the time it went into commission and remained on it until it was released from United States Naval service; discharged Sept. 17, 1919, Pittsburgh, Pa., seaman.

John Paul Salisbury entered the service Aug. 1, 1918, and was assigned to 510th Squadron, Aviation Corps, Regular Army; Speedway, Indianapolis; discharged March 25, 1919, Indianapolis, sergeant.

Carl Lee Berthele entered the service May 24, 1918, and was assigned to 48th company, 12th battalion, 159th D. B. Infantry, Camp Taylor, Ky.

Treatment at Camp Taylor for influenza, pneumonia and pleural effusions discharged May 27, 1919, corporal.

Ray Harvey Bowman entered the service July 24, 1918, and was assigned to 4th battery, F. A. R. D., Camp Taylor, Ky.; embarked from Hoboken, N. J., Oct. 20, 1918, and arrived at Liverpool, England, Nov. 8, 1918; trained at Camp Hunt, France, Nov. 10 till January 10, 1919; sailed for United States April 20, 1919; arrived at Boston, Mass.; discharged May 14, 1919.

At Front to Finish.

Frank McKinley Eaton entered the service April 11, 1918, and was assigned to Company D, First Replacement Regiment of Engineers; embarked from Hoboken, June 13, 1918 and arrived in Brest, France, June 28, 1918; battles; On front from August 20, 1918 to Nov. 11, 1918; was in St. Mihiel drive; sailed for United States, Feb. 25, 1919 and arrived Newport News, March 11, 1919; discharged March 25, 1919. Army of occupation in Germany.

Russell Lowell Lamm entered the service June 21, 1918 as fireman and was assigned to U. S. Alabama and U. S. S. Onward—patrol duty; discharged January 14, 1919 U. S. S. Onward, fireman.

Carl J. Maag entered the service July 27, 1917, as private and was assigned to Fifth M. O. R. S., Fifth Division; embarked from Hoboken, May 27, 1918 and arrived at Liverpool, England, June 8, 1918; battles, St. Mihiel, Sept. 12, 16, 1918—Meuse Argonne, Sept. 26 to Nov. 11, 1918; sailed for United States, July 18, 1919 and arrived New York, July 31, 1919; discharged August 9, 1919, sergeant.

Charles Franklin Grant entered the service May 31, 1918 as private and was assigned to Company A, 54th Engineers, National Army; embarked from New York, June 29, 1918 and arrived at Liverpool, England, July 7, 1918; sailed for United States, Aug. 28, 1919 and arrived in Hoboken, N. J., Sept. 11, 1919; discharged Nov. 12, 1919.

Went Up Rapidly.

Aloysius Peter Otten entered the

service Nov. 12, 1917, and was assigned to 215th Baking company, 89th division, Fort Riley Kansas; later at Camp Funston Kansas; discharged Feb. 28, 1919.

Byron Bishop Oldaker entered the service Sept. 19, 1917, and was assigned to Company B, 58th Engineers, 13th grand division; embarked from Hoboken, N. J., Nov. 26, 1917, arrived in St. Nazaire, France, Dec. 10, 1917; went over with a lumber jack outfit and worked at that until the Americans started to operate the railroads.

Paul Raymond Craig entered the service Dec. 20, 1917, and was assigned to 261st Aero squadron, Aviation corps, Scott Field, and Washington, D. C.; sailed for the United States Nov. 23, 1918, and arrived in New York, Dec. 5, 1918; discharged May 23, 1919; musician, first class.

Carl Fred Burkhardt entered the service Aug. 8, 1917, and was assigned to Company M, 151st regiment, 38th Division, National Guard; embarked from Montreal, Canada, Oct. 3, 1918, and arrived in Liverpool, Eng., Oct. 18, 1918; trained in France; sailed for United States April 25, 1919; arrived Hoboken, N. J., May 8, 1919; discharged May 23, 1919; musician, first class.

Ray Harold Rosers entered the service Aug. 28, 1918, and was assigned to Third Company, O. T. C., Infantry, Regular Army; commissioned
