

## FLINT'S SENTENCE 2 TO 14; SUSPENDED BY JUDGE SPRINGER

LIBERTY, Ind., April 15.—Everett Flint was given a suspended sentence of two to 14 years and costs, Wednesday, by Judge L. Springer. Last July Flint cut the throat of Lester Dalrymple, while engaged in a conversation with him.

The cut required several stitches, and only through the prompt and efficient service of a physician was Dalrymple's life saved. Flint was ordered by the local court to be committed to the Epileptic Village at Newcastle for an indefinite period.

Upon entrance he remained only for a period of two weeks, since which time he has been living with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. O. P. Flint, at their home west of Liberty. The charge was brought by Dalrymple.
