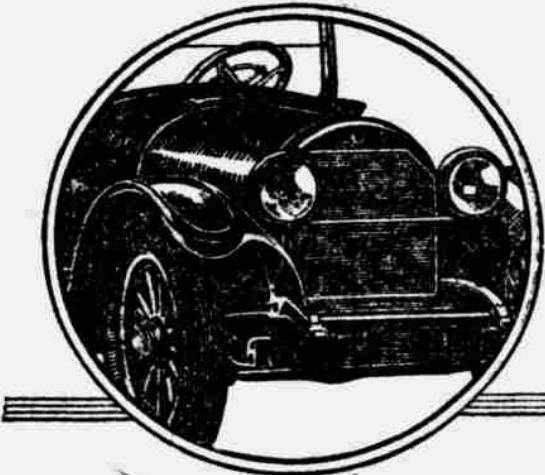

### WHAT IT COSTS!

WASHINGTON, April 15.—National prohibition enforcement should not cost more than \$5,000,000 a year, according to Wayne B. Wheeler, counsel for the Anti-Saloon League, in a letter

read today in the Senate by Chairman Warren, of the Appropriations Committee. Although the letter would be "given due weight," Senator Warren said, "it would cost a good deal more than that and every Senator here knows it." Mr. Wheeler's letter was prompted by a recent statement in the Senate that enforcement would cost \$50,000,000 a year.



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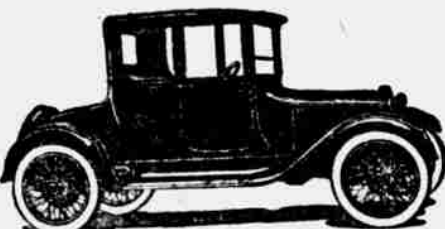
