

PREBLE COUNTY TAX RETURNS ARE COMING IN WELL, IS REPORT

EATON, O., April 17.—Voluntary personal tax returns are coming in satisfactorily at this time, according to S. E. Fowler, chief tax deputy in the offices of County Auditor S. C. Hunt. Since the beginning of the taxing period, April 11, the returns have been coming in at the rate of several hundred a day.

Approximately 8,000 blanks were sent out. The time limit for filing returns expires May 1.

Quarantine restrictions were lifted Friday from the home of Deputy County Clerk J. S. Barnhisser, where for some time his son Waldo, was ill of scarlet fever. It was the only case of the disease in the city.

American Navy to Use Standard Time at Sea

WASHINGTON, April 17.—Ships of the American navy will keep their clocks at Standard time, while at sea, as determined by the 24 standard time zones into which the surface of the globe is divided, under a general order announced today by the navy department. Hitherto while at sea, a ship's time was adjusted according to the position at noon each day. The British, French and Italian navies already have adopted the new method.

Corn Intended for Rats, Poisons Horses in Preble

EATON, O., April 17.—It is thought that poison placed for rats was carried by the rodents into corn that cost the lives of two horses. Another animal that ate of the corn is seriously ill.

A tenant on the farm of Pliny Deem, near Eaton, bought from another farmer a quantity of corn with which to feed his stock. He fed some of the corn to his three horses and two of them died and a third animal is in a bad way. When illness attacked the animals it is said to have indicated poisoning.

The seller of the grain is said to have stated that he had placed poison-

ing around his store of corn for the purpose of exterminating rats that were attacking the corn. Upon this statement is based the belief that the rats probably carried the poison into the corn.

Another farmer is said to have fed some of his hogs from some of the same corn, but it is said they suffered no ill effects.
