

MARKET IS STRONG AT WEEK-END; CATTLE SLIGHTLY TOPHEAVY

Hogs advanced 10 to 40 cents at Chicago on Saturday, making a top of \$16.80 against \$15.90 Friday and \$15.60 on Tuesday, when the bulk of sales went at \$14.75 to \$15.45, against \$14.90 to \$16.10 at the week end.

The general average for the day, \$15.45, was \$1.05 above the average price on the previous Saturday, when so few were received on account of the strike. Saturday's average was 80 cents above three weeks ago, just preceding the strike period.

Due to the fact that many shipping orders went over Sunday and many traders predicted higher prices, Chicago's receipts for the week were: Cattle, 7,000; hogs, 46,330; sheep, 41,440. It is expected that live stock receipts will be about normal at all Western points from now on.

Cattle Trade Topheavy.

In spite of the advance in hogs, cattle were top heavy on Saturday, and prices were \$1.00 to \$1.20 below Thursday's high, but at that were \$1.00 above those of three weeks ago. Sheep and lambs closed at the high point of the week at Chicago, best wooled lambs going at \$21.50.

The Indianapolis market was active on hogs and decidedly slow on cattle, on Saturday. While the best hogs sold up to \$17.00 against a top of \$17.25 on Friday, cattle were weak under the pressure of 800 fresh receipts, or almost four times the normal for Saturday. The absence of important local buyers led to a decline of 50 cents in bids from outside buyers of steers, some even cutting off \$1.00 which resulted in many being carried over. However, the highest prices of the year were paid for some choice cattle at Indianapolis this week, and there was an advance of \$1.50 in cattle, compared with final prices a week ago.

asking for copies of the system which is proving so successful in the Hoosier commonwealth.

The first county organization to complete a membership drive under the uniform plan was Madison county and, according to figures sent to Lewis Taylor, general secretary, this unit has moved into first place in the race for state membership honors. Shelby county is running a close second with Rush county in third position among the eighty-three county associations affiliated with the parent organization.

At the meeting of general secretaries of farmers' associations of the middle west held here during the last week the operative plan as worked out by the Indiana executives was highly praised. The high cost of organizing has been a hard problem for a number of the states to solve, and the visiting secretaries declared that there were many valuable pointers to be patterned after in the new system being used in Indiana, where the cost per member has run unusually low compared with other states, one of

which reported that organization work was costing as high as \$1.50 a member.

A number of important suggestions were recommended. One of these approved the attitude of the American Farm Bureau federation in declaring the measure of compensation for labor should be for service rendered rather than for hours employed. A recommendation was passed to the effect that the national organization discourage and repudiate in every legitimate manner the statement that greater production on the part of the farmer will reduce the present high cost of living, but rather will tend to reduce the farmer's income. Less extravagance and more work to bring about

the desired results in the most satisfactory manner were urged.

FARM LOSS \$1,030,560

LAPORTE, Ind., April 19.—The loss to farmers in this county through destruction of the winter wheat crop by the recent cold snap and snows is estimated by County Agent Buechner at \$1,030,560. The agriculture situation in this county is acute, and in wheat fields it is so serious that the yield has been cut 50 per cent.
