of rates for telephone service, effective May 1, 1920:

The net rates shall be charged when the account is paid on or before the
first day of the last month of each quarter; however the gross rates will be
charged.

*Plus a line mileage charge of \$25 per month for each
quarter mile or fraction thereof beyond the corporate limits.
No discount shall apply to the line mileage charge.
