

PREBLE BOYS HELD FOR IMPLICATION IN M'NEAL CO. ROBBERY

EATON, O., July 1.—Frank O'Dell, 18, residing near Eaton, and Walter O'Dell, 20, of Camden, are held in the county jail here in default of \$500 bond each on a burglary charge. They are alleged to have been implicated in a robbery of the grocery store of H. McNeal & Son. They are cousins.

Arrest of the O'Dells followed the arrest of Rife Pittsinger, 17, son of a farmer living near Eaton, upon a charge of having figured in the McNeal robbery. He confessed and implicated the O'Dells.

The trio implicated another young man, whom the police say was the ring leader in the burglary. He is being sought.

Police say two separate visits were made to the McNeal store, the first visit netting about \$14 and the second about \$8, along with several boxes of candy.

About the same time the McNeal robbery took place, the local department store of Spring Bros. Co. was entered and robbed of \$76.

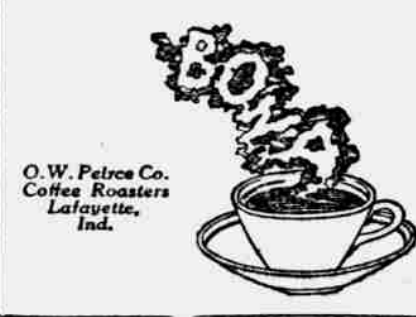
