

HARDING GETS BIG WELCOME FROM HOME FOLKS AT MARION, O.

MARION, O., July 6.—Senator Warren G. Harding, the Republican nominee for president, was welcomed home to Marion Monday, and in a brief speech expressed his gratitude for the favors shown him by the home folks.

The senator and Mrs. Harding, who made the trip from Washington by motor car, reached their home at 1:25 o'clock Monday afternoon.

The senator took a brief rest before he appeared before several thousand of Marion citizens and admirers from other Ohio cities.

Mr. Harding spoke intimately with his fellow townsmen of their joint efforts to make Marion a greater and better city, their tributes paid him on other occasions when he had been a victor in political battles, and especially the tribute of indorsement shown him by the county at the April primaries.

He said that if he had to choose between the tribute paid by his home county in the primary, and that extended by the Chicago convention, he would choose the former, "because you knowing me made it the finest tribute to which one may aspire."

The address of welcome was made by D. R. Crissinger, president of the Marion civic association.

If the admonition of Crissinger, himself a Democrat, comes true, Senator Harding will ride the Democratic mule into the white house next November. "I admonish you, my fellow citizens," he said, "that he will ride the Democratic mule into the white house in November, as president of the United States."

Going farther than predicting Senator Harding's election, Mr. Crissinger said he knew "your enthusiasm and appreciation will prompt your votes to be cast irrespective of party ties, so as to make it possible for each of you to extend the right hand of fellowship to Florence Harding as the first lady of the land, and to Warren G. Harding as the president of the United States."

BUENOS AIRES, July 6.—Young Argentines by the thousands ought to be sent to North American universities, says La Prensa, "in order to assimilate the manners of work, the methods of scientific investigation, the rapidity of execution and above all the vigor and eager vitality that characterizes North American life."

Irish Local and State Governments Opposed

DUBLIN, July 6.—The net results of the recent county council elections in that now both in the cities and in the counties in 23 out of 32 counties, the local government is in direct hostility to the central government.

The first conflict between them will arise out of the question of paying compensation for outrage. Every day the judges are awarding to the relatives of murdered policemen, to injured policemen and to owners of burned police premises large sums as compensation chargeable on the local rates. The total already runs up close to £750,000.

The local authorities have refused to collect taxes for these payments. In the case of some of them the government can secure money by deductions from the sums payable to the local authorities by the imperial exchequer in relief of local taxes.

In the majority of cases the parties awarded compensation have only acquired a right to sue the local authorities in the courts for the money. It is believed that even after judgment is given, the local authorities will refuse to pay. Many of them have passed resolutions saying they will recognize no authority save that of Dail Eireann.

PRINCE TO SPEND TWO DAYS IN JAMAICA PORT

KINGSTON, Jamaica, July 6.—The Prince of Wales is expected to arrive in Kingston on September 23 next on board the battleship Renown. He will proceed to Knutsford, a picturesque park, three miles from Kingston, where a big agricultural fair has been arranged in his honor. In the afternoon the Prince will make a tour of the country parishes where he will view the beauty spots of the island. He returns to Kingston the following day and his visit will end with a big ball at King's House. This function promises to be the largest held here in recent years.

New York to Nome Is Route Laid for 'Planes

(By Associated Press)

WASHINGTON, July 6.—Four army airplanes will undertake a flight from New York, July 15, to Nome, Alaska, and return, a distance of 8,690 miles. It was announced today at the war department. The purpose will be to demonstrate the practicability of commercial air lines to Alaska, and thus expedite development of the territory.

DeHaviland planes, supplied with Liberty motors, will be used. Nearly one-fourth of the flight will be across Canada and the war department announcement said that the Canadian government had extended unusual courtesies during the preliminary arrangements for the expedition.

PROVISIONS, CORN, PLUNGE DOWNWARD

CHICAGO, Ill., July 6.—Unusually sharp downturns took place today in the prices of corn and provisions. Under heavy selling pressure September and December delivery dropped, respectively, 5@8 1/2c and 5@6 1/2c. September touched 157 1/2 and

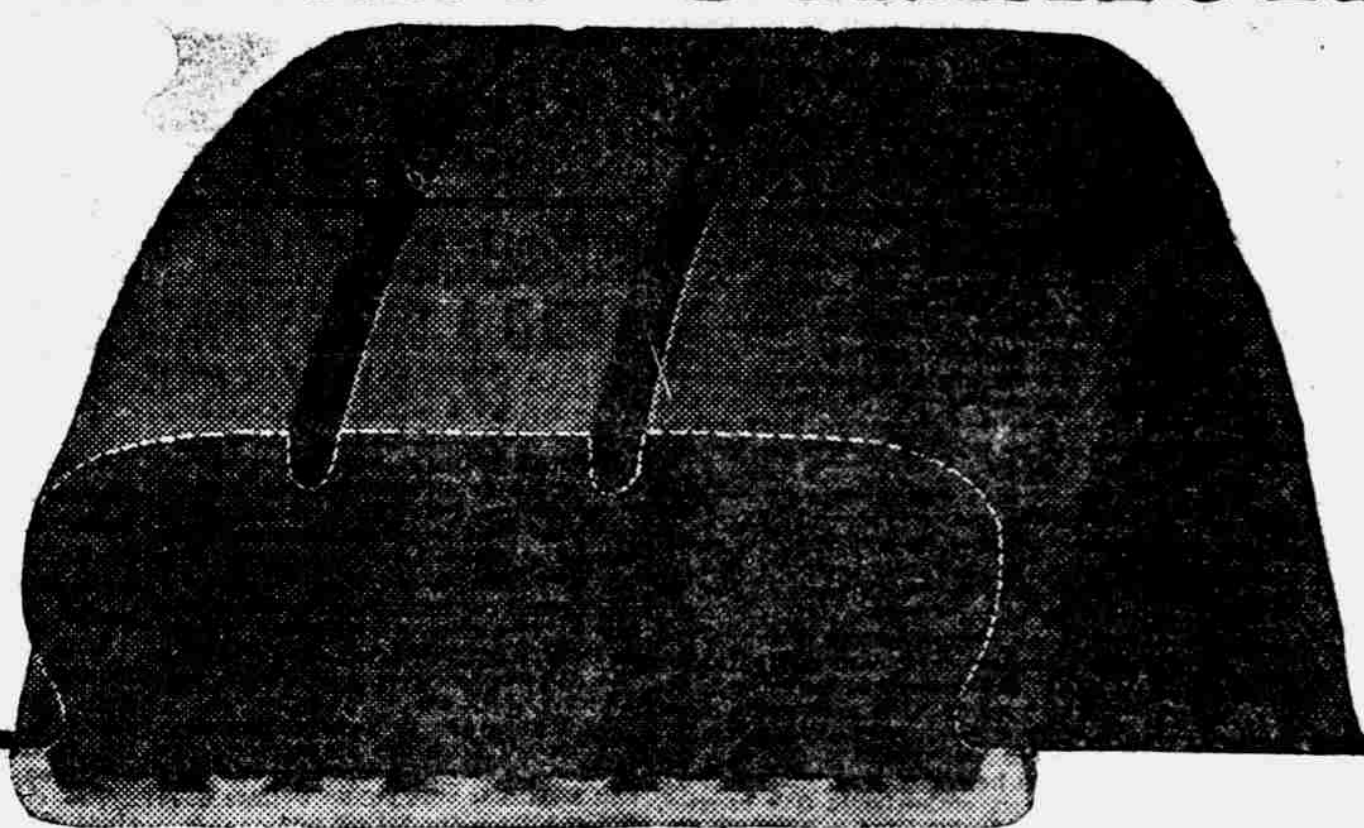
December 148 1/2. Big receipts and good crop conditions were the chief reasons given. Huge stocks of provisions brought about a decline of about \$1 a barrel for pork and \$1 a cwt. for lard.

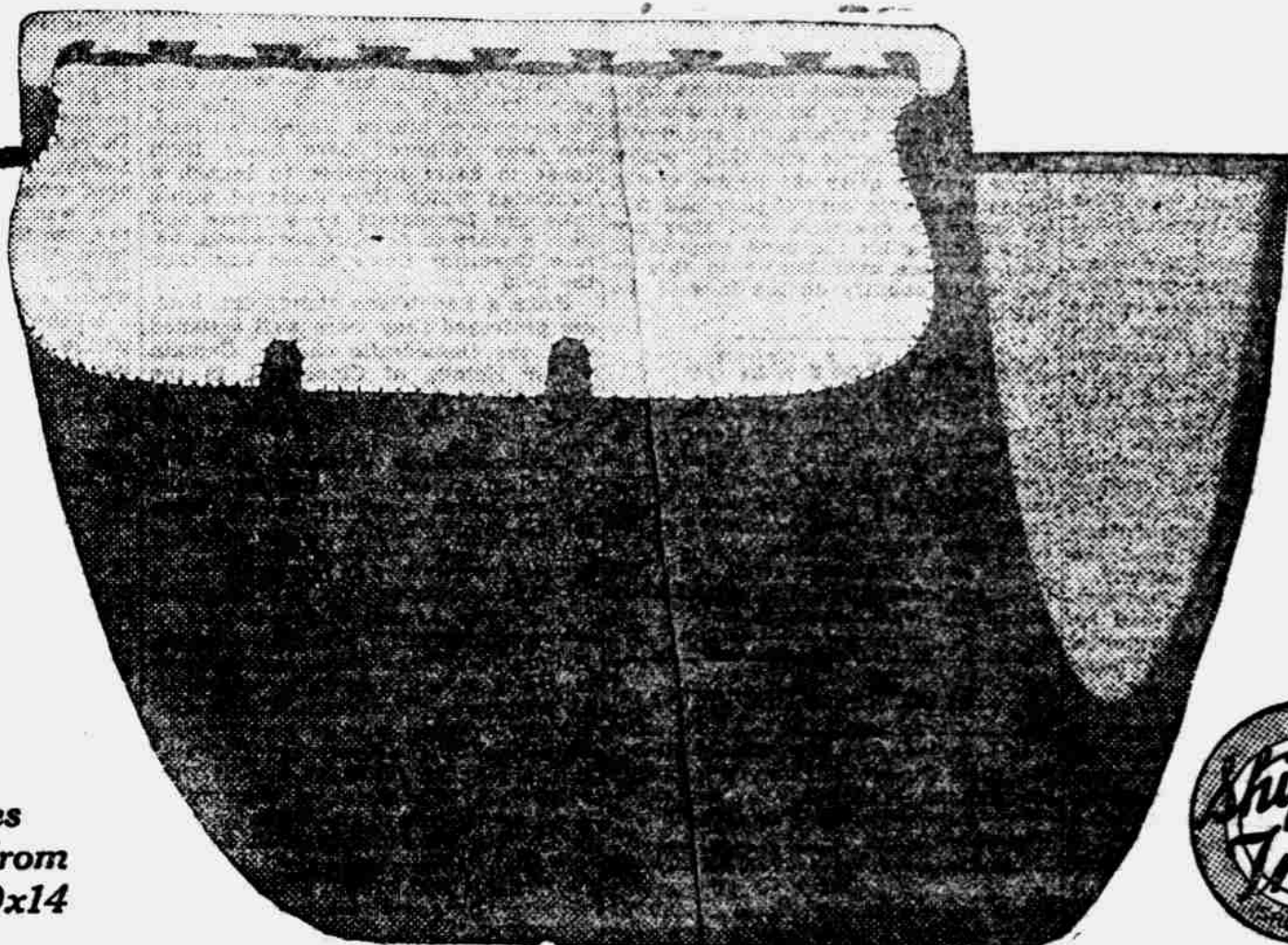
