OBITUARY 1B

Samuel Walter Roberts was born January 18, 1874, died July 13, 1920, aged 46 years, 6 months, 8 days. He was the son of Samuel E. and Jane Roberts, and was born in the Pleasant Hill neighborhood, where he spent his entire life, except the last year, when he lived in Richmond.

In September, 1892, he was married to Miss Lily Noggle. To this union were born five children, one dying at the age of 4.

The deceased leaves to mourn his loss his three children, Roy, Faye and Mrs. George Kuth, of Dayton; his aged mother, the sisters, Mrs. Delbert Funk and Mrs. Newell H. Pugh, of Hillman; one half-brother, Willis Roberts, of New Paris; and a half-sister, Mrs. A. L. Reid, of Richmond.

In early life he united with the United Brethren church in Pleasant Hill.

To his children, he was all a father could be; tender, loving, and thinking only of their welfare.

A short time ago, while crossing a street in Richmond, he was struck by an auto and severely injured. Since that time his health has steadily declined, medical science being powerless to combat the internal injury.

Early in the spring, he bought a home near the pumping station, where he spent his last days with his daughter, the late Anna, and died suddenly from uremic poisoning caused by the disease of kidneys.

The funeral was held at the United Brethren church at Pleasant Hill and was conducted by the Rev. Mr. Hunt of Phillipsburg, assisted by the Rev. Mr. James of Remond and the Rev. Mr. Walbaum of Dayton.

The pall-bearers were Everett Reid, Willie Reid, Alvin Dickey, Vernon Morrison, Fred White and Etienne Reid. The interment was in Springlawn cemetery, at New Paris, Ohio.
