CHICAGO, Oct. 5.—Short covering today. Corn and oats news not changing seriously but the markets are liquidated. Foreigners have bought wheat. December corn at 85 cents represents 70 cents on the farm or even less. While there are reports of new corn contracted at Chicago, 80 cents. On Chicago basis the farm price now looks low. The statement that France will buy 50,000,000 wheat between Nov. 1 and July 1, is regarded significant. Argentine new wheat crop news still suggests 100,000,000 surplus. October report due Friday, 2:15 p.m., eastern time. Any firmness in wheat can now mean good rallies in corn.
