Lytle, representing the Ohio Federation of Farm bureaus, will address a farmers' meeting here Saturday afternoon in the courthouse auditorium, as a preliminary to a membership campaign that will be launched next Monday by the Preble County Farm bureau. The meeting is scheduled for two o'clock.

In the membership drive to be inaugurated Monday by the county farm bureau it is expected each farmer in the county will be solicited for membership in the organization.

W. E. Schiltz, manager of the grain elevator of the Eaton Farmers' Equity company, in commenting upon market conditions, states it is his belief that wheat will sell at \$1.50 a bushel. He says he expects to see corn sell as low as 60 cents a bushel.

Manager Schiltz says the company's elevator handled and moved at least 90 per cent of this year's wheat crop in this vicinity, and that the bulk of it was marketed at much higher levels than prevail at this time.
