

GRILLE AND LONGE, WINCHESTER DEALERS IN JUNK; QUARREL

WINCHESTER, Ind., Nov. 3.—Tony Longe and Andy Grille pleaded guilty to a charge of assault and battery Tuesday in Squire George Coats' court and each paid a fine and costs amounting to \$12.50.

The two men had a fight Saturday night at Longe's home, and were taken into custody by Sheriff U. N. Davis and Deputy U. S. Daly. It is said that Grille and Longe's 17-year-old daughter are sweethearts and wish to marry. Longe objects on account of the daughter being his housekeeper and the only one to care for his six children, and he fears Grille will take her away from Winchester to reside. Longe and Grille are in business together, the junk business.

Thornburg Dead at Home.
Isaac W. Thornburg, 63, is dead at his home four miles southeast of Winchester, after a long illness of heart trouble. He survived by an invalid widow and six children, Frank and Forest Thornburg, Mrs. Arlie Rowe, Mrs. Mito Shade and Mrs. George Locke.

It became known Tuesday that the marriage of Peter L. Brouse and Effie Hardesty was solemnized by Squire George Coats, in his office, Saturday evening. Mr. and Mrs. Brouse will reside in Ridgeville.

Smallpox Closes School.
Several cases of smallpox are reported in this city and county. The Oliver P. Morton school, in the northeast part of the city, is closed. Several children from that school are reported as having the disease. Also one case has been reported from the Lincoln school consolidated, west of the city. It seems to be in a light form, and the physicians seem to think it will not be a serious epidemic at this time.

W. M. Hissom Dead.
W. M. Hissom, 62, secretary and treasurer of the Union City Carriage company, is dead at his home in that city, following an operation after an illness of several weeks. He is survived by the widow and one daughter, Mary Jean Hissom.

Accused Negro Captured.
A negro said to have murdered a policeman at Columbus, Ohio, on last Thursday night, was captured at Ridgeville, Saturday, he being taken from the westbound passenger train. The negro was seen at Urbana, Ohio, after having escaped from the officers. Later he was seen again, but eluded the officer. He was not captured until the train reached Ridgeville.

In a special car, about 50 members of Winchester Chapter, No. 30, Eastern Star, went to Union City Friday evening, where they participated in the first anniversary celebration of the Union City chapter. This chapter instituted that lodge, one year ago.

To Erect New Depot.
The Big Four railroad has taken an option on the ground beginning at the railroad on the east side of East street and running north to Short street, and east to the Guthrie residence, as a location for the new Big Four depot. On account of double tracking, the present depot will have to be torn away, as the survey places the north track on the ground where it now is.

Damage Suit Rested.
The damage suit of Daniel B. Aldstadt vs. the Union Traction company and Walker D. Hines, federal administrator of railways of the United States, and the Lake Erie & Western railroad company, which has been on trial in the Randolph county circuit court since Monday, rested Saturday, and Judge Shockney dismissed the jury until Thursday, November 4. He granted each of the six attorneys one hour each for argument, which will take place on that day. The case was vented here from the Delaware circuit court.

Funeral services were held from his late home Monday afternoon, the Rev. Harvey Thornburg officiating. Randolph Post, No. 39, American Legion, and the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan had charge.


