CROWD BRAVES COLD TO SEE FIREWORKS

Varicolored rockets and blinding flares lit up the west side of Richmond Thursday night when the quantity of fireworks secured from the Indianapolis recruiting service was fired by members of the local army squad from the west bank of Whitewater river.

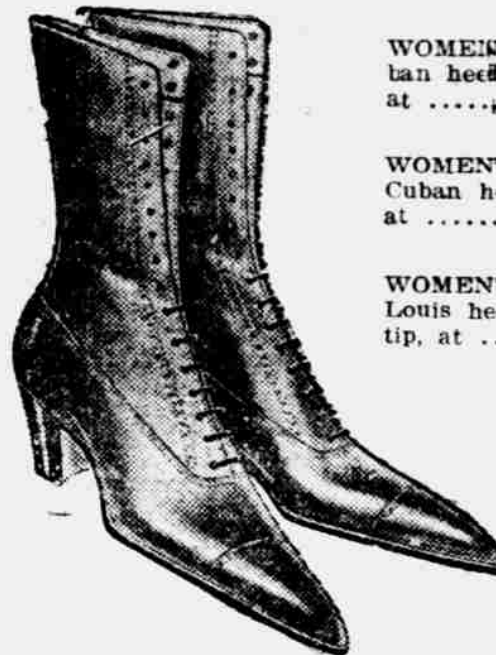

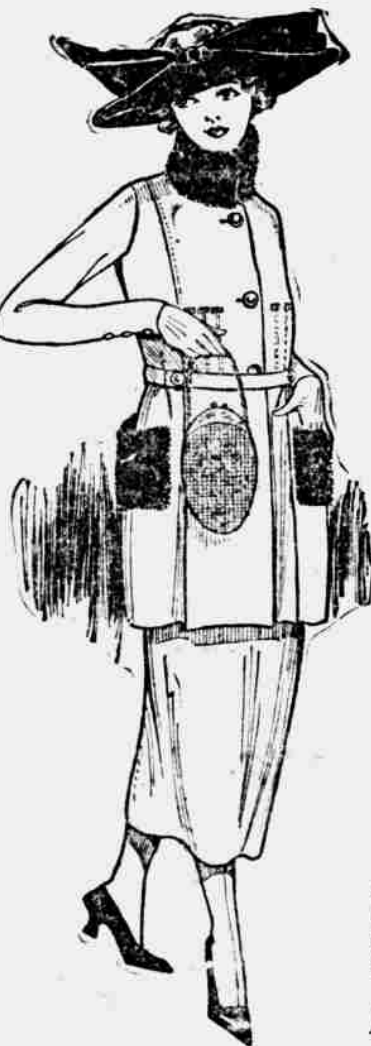
