

## CITY STARTS PROBE TO EXPLAIN CRASH OF SCHOOL ANNEX

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 19.—Steps for a searching investigation into the cause of the collapse yesterday of the three-story annex to the Emmehrich Manual Training high school, resulting in the death of one workman and the injury of 21, were taken last night by L. F. Paul F. Robinson, county coroner, with the view to presenting his findings to the Marion county grand jury if the evidence shows criminal negligence in the construction of the building.

At the investigation which will start at 9 o'clock this morning, Dr. Robinson has invited Jacob H. Hilkens, head of the city fire prevention department; Chief John C. Loucks of the fire department; Chief of Police Kinney and Walter B. Stern, city building inspector, to assist.

Subpoenas were turned over to the police department last night by Dr. Robinson, calling for the appearance of Fred Junglauss, general contractor for the building; Robert Berner of the Hetherington & Berner Steel and Iron works, contractors for the steel work, and Carl Ittenbach of the Ittenbach Stone company, which has the stone contract for the building. Herman Scherrer of the firm of Adolph Scherrer, architects for the building, and the foremen for the various contractors and workmen are also to be called before the coroner.

Estimate Damage at \$75,000.  
The property damage caused by the collapse could only be estimated, as the contractors declared they were unable to give a figure until the work of clearing out the debris was started and the full extent of the damage ascertained. The school board has paid the contractors \$114,000 on the contract price of approximately \$450,000. It had been estimated that about \$152,000 worth of construction work had been completed. It is believed that at least one-half of the work was destroyed by the collapse. This would place the loss at approximately \$75,000.

News that the building collapsed at 11:40 o'clock yesterday morning spread rapidly over the city. Parents of students at the South side high school rushed to the scene of the tragedy, as they believed that a part of the old school building had fallen. Telephone calls to the police and newspapers were so great in number that they could hardly be answered. Investigation developed that the contractors had consulted early yesterday over the advisability of placing a large wooden derrick on the top of the building to hoist stone for the side walls. According to the statements made, it had been decided to place guy wires at one to prevent damage to the building by the weight and vibration of the derrick.

## PORTUGUESE SCHOLAR NOW IN POORHOUSE

LISBON, Nov. 18.—The newspaper, Seculo, says that Dr. Jose de Arriaga, a university man, historian, critic and savant and brother of the late President Manuel de Arriaga, is an inmate of the Lisbon poorhouse, in ill health and penniless.

Dr. Jose de Arriaga resided for a long time in Brazil where he collected notes on Brazilian life and literature. It was after his return to Portugal when he was arranging with an editor for the publication of a book on Brazil that he was taken ill and, after a struggle against adversity, was obliged from utter lack of resources to take refuge in the poorhouse.

Alfonso III., of Portugal in the seventeenth generation and of King Ramiro II of Leon and Castile and the twelfth fifth grandson of Hugh Capet, Duke of France and Count of Paris and Orleans.

His brother, the late president, died a poor man partly because of his inflexible republican opinions which led him to refuse, at one time, to serve as tutor to the sons of the then King of Portugal.
