## CLEANSING CREAMS

There are few women who can get along without using some sort of cold cream. I am not particularly in favor of cosmetics—at least, not when exercise and common sense methods of living are so much more desirable as a means to beauty. But cold cream I consider as necessary as soap, and in some cases, even more necessary.

If you have a dry skin you will need a cold cream containing a certain amount of vegetable oil, since this is readily absorbed; but if you have a normal skin and no wrinkles to bother you can get along just as well with a mineral oil cream which simply cleanses.

An excellent formula for such a cream is as follows:

White Wax.....1 ounce  
Spermaceti.....1 ounce  
White Mineral Oil.....5 ounces  
Rose Water.....1/2 ounces  
Powdered Borax.....30 grains  
Perfumed oil.....15 drops

Melt the wax, spermaceti and oil together over a slow fire. When all are melted together remove from the heat, add the borax and slowly pour in the rose water, which has been slightly warmed. Stir and beat until the liquid begins to congeal, then pour off into a jar.

A little of this can be rubbed into the face before it is washed in order to avoid chapping from the winter winds. After a train ride or a long journey in the car or carriage a little of this cream should be rubbed in before any water touches the face. It can be used as a general cleanser and even rubbed into the skin before exposure to cold winds. It is nothing but a cleansing agent; it will not grow hair; all it does is to get out dirt from the pores where even soap and water will not reach.

Anxious—It is so hard to get rid of freckles that it is much better to spend your efforts in avoiding them rather than curing them. All mild skin bleaches will help to remove them, but can never be absolutely depended upon.

Blackheads are another matter. You must, first of all, have your digestion in good order, and you must be sure that there is no constipation. Then you can begin to treat the black pores themselves. This is rubbed into the skin when the pores are open and absorbs the black grease of the blackheads. When it is washed out much of this blackness comes with it. ZAHAVANA, Nov. 19.—During the series of baseball games played by the New York Giants in this city, Babe Ruth, the champion home run hitter, compiled a batting average of .345, but managed to hit only twice for the circuit. He scored five times. His efforts with the bat resulted in two home runs, three triples, three doubles and two singles. He struck out six times.

Ruth was signed by a local promoter for ten more games in this city. During the contracts in which he figured during his first series here capacity crowds gathered at the baseball park, the enthusiasts having but one ambition—to see Babe hit the ball out of the park.

Torriente, a member of a team which met the Giants last week, eclipsed the efforts of Ruth by hitting three homers in one game. As a result of this feat he has been named by local lovers of baseball as the "Babe Ruth of Cuba."

### Mrs. Mary Duerr, Oxford, Dies Suddenly; Physician Gives Poisoning as Cause

OXFORD, O., Nov. 19.—Mrs. Mary B. Duerr, aged 61 years, wife of Jacob C. Duerr, died suddenly yesterday at the home of her son, Charles J. Duerr. She was taken ill with what her physician says was intestinal poisoning, and died in twelve hours. Mrs. Duerr had gone to her son's home to assist his wife in caring for her father, John McGonigle, whose condition from hardening of the arteries is critical.

Also the affair is being planned as a farewell for Dr. Alfred H. Upham, Miami's alumni secretary, who will leave on the day following Thanksgiving to become president of the University of Idaho.

### New York Wages Double Those of 1914; Is Report

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—Average earnings in this city's representative trades in September, 1920, were double what they were six years ago and, generally, \$2 a week higher than they were a year ago, according to a report prepared by the Industrial Bureau of the Merchants' Association. The report declared that while the city's industrial activity has receded somewhat from the high water mark established during the war, there is no indication of a general slump in manu-

facturing.
