

GERMAN CHANCELLOR ACCUSES NOTABLES OF BEING SMUGGLERS

BERLIN, Nov. 24.—One hundred eminent persons, among them Crown Princess Cecile, Prince Eitel Friedrich, Prince August Wilhelm, the late Prince Joachim, Count Padolin and Princess Wanda Radziwill, have smuggled to Holland money aggregating 250,000,000 marks, asserted Hermann Mueller, former German chancellor, in the Reichstag Tuesday.

The former chancellor interpellated the government relative to the activities of the firm of Crusser and Phillips, bankers, which is declared to have carried on an extensive business in smuggling properties of Germany. It was asserted that the head of the banking firm had been enrolled in the German army and was on good terms with the nobility, and that the concern had "been known publicly as a special firm for the carrying on of contraband in goods and capital."

It was said to have grown so large that it was able to buy eventually about 10,000,000 shares in the firm of Schlesinger, Trier and Company.

"I ask the government" said the former chancellor, "what has been done in the case of the banking firm of Sinner, Borsigland & Company, which has been accused of smuggling. I demand that people known as smugglers should be severely punished."

Probe Hangs Fire.
Replying, Dr. Wirth, minister of finance, said the public prosecutor had not concluded his investigation of the Sinner, Borsigland & Company case, but he asserted that the banking houses mentioned were evidently engaged in smuggling capital out of the country. "The government," he continued, "learned a few days ago that millions of its cash and securities were standing to the credit of German subjects with the firm of Crusser & Phillips, in Amsterdam, and that these millions had gone there through an intermediary in contravention of German laws."

The public prosecutor started an inquiry into the flight of this capital, and the firm's books have been seized. Proceedings are pending against a number of persons who sent money to Holland, but I am unable to give exact details. It is correct that among persons having accounts with Crusser, Phillips and company are members of princely houses and some of the Hohenzollern family. The finance department has been instructed to demand security up to the highest possible figure from customers from the Crosser bank.

Blushes With Shame.
"When one reads the list of people who did business with this bank he must blush with shame. It has made

a strange impression to learn that princely personages employed the Crusser firm as a letter bearer. Every effort was made to apprehend Crusser by surrounding his office, but he was warned and succeeded in escaping."

Professor Kahl, a member of the German People's party, declared Herr Mueller was "trying to throw mud on the Hohenzollerns and the monarchy." He asserted Crusser had only once visited Crown Princess Cecile in order to hand her a letter from the Crown Prince.

FAST PLANES GATHER FOR PULITZER RACE

MINEOLA, N. Y., Nov. 24.—Attracted by the promise of new world's flying records, airplane enthusiasts gathered at Mitchell field here Tuesday for the first of the trial events for the Pulitzer trophy race, Thanksgiving day. Planes rated as the speediest in the world were entered in the pre-liminaries.

Army air service pilots confidently predicted that their pet machine, the six hundred horse-power plane which was the entry of the United States in the James Gordon Bennett that races at Etampes, France, would eclipse the record of 152 miles attained in France. Lieut. C. C. Moseley who went to France as alternate to Captain Rudolph Schroeder, was selected as pilot. The air service entry went into the air at Etampes with Captain Schroeder as pilot but a mechanical defect cut it out of the contest.

The course for the trial flights here is one mile and one kilometre. Officials of the Aero Club of America, observers at the trials will certify the records made to the Federation aeronautique internationale.

Factory Office Employees Gain on Salary Earnings

ALBANY, N. Y., Dec. 24.—Factory office employees in New York state received \$2.13 more a week during October than did the factory workers, according to a report made public today by the state industrial commission. It shows that factory office em-

ployees averaged \$31.06 a week as against \$28.93 for the factory workers. The weekly earnings of the factory workers showed an increase of 20 cents over the September average, the report says, due largely to the unusual activity in several industries and to full time operations in plants that were affected by holidays in September. Salaries of office employees have increased fourteen per cent since Oct. 1919, compared with a gain of 19 per cent in the earnings of factory workers.

Increases in manufacturing activity in October the report states, occurred chiefly in New York city.


