

WOULD CHANGE LINE OF LEVEE TO AVOID DESTROYING OLD TREE

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 29.—Sentiment such as expressed in the poem of George Pope Morris, entitled "Woodman, Spare That Tree," may save a giant sycamore which towers over the Wabash river bottoms near the junction of the Patoka and Wabash rivers in Gibson county, Indiana. The tree is close to the line of survey for a new \$2,000,000 levee, and it must be removed or the line of survey must be changed at considerable expense.

Efforts are being made by the state department of conservation and citizens of Gibson county, as well as the citizens of Mt. Carmel, Ill., to prevent the destruction of the tree. Unless public sentiment is sufficiently strong to cause the commissioners of Gibson county to slightly change the survey, or a public subscription can be raised to pay for such a change, it appears this monarch and sole survivor of the days when that portion of Indiana was thickly wooded is doomed. That sentiment is strong in Gibson county, as well as at Mt. Carmel, Ill., just across the river, toward saving the big sycamore, is evidenced in numerous letters reaching the state department asking that no efforts be spared in behalf of the old monarch.

Robert Ridgeway, a noted ornithologist, connected with the United States Biological Survey, whose home is at Olney, Ill., has written the department registering a plea in behalf of the tree. He says that in 1875 this tree was one of twelve of the same species growing on an area not exceeding half a mile square, which averaged 23½ feet in circumference and 127 feet in spread of top, by actual measurement, and about 150 feet in height. The lone sycamore remains of all its former sturdy brothers.

This tree stands near the site of the new levee that will be constructed along the Wabash river, and according to Dr. Ridgeway it is not so close to the line of contemplated work that its removal is really necessary, although persons in charge of the survey have expressed their intentions of cutting it down.

the lowest general death rate in the history of the city. There has been only one death from typhoid fever there in nearly three years, and only four cases.

Aid Derelicts.

Dayton acknowledges its efforts to restore human derelicts. A model correction farm, and dormitory without locks or bars, had displaced an inhumane and insanitary workhouse,

These lots are plowed by the young people, the seed is furnished the work supervised by a competent corps of instructors and inspectors, and at the end of the season the boys and girls are given prizes for their work. Not only are they taught constructive effort, but they get health, all the vegetables they raise and are inspired to best effort by being com-

pensated for their work.

Through Dayton's free legal aid bureau many persons are given counsel and advice, and problems adjudicated. This bureau has dissipated the many contentions between landlord and tenant. In addition, loan sharks have been put completely out of business and installment houses have adopted the wise policy of dealing fairly with customers.

Dayton in 1913 had one acre of park

space for each 5,886 people. Today, through purchase and gift, it has one acre of recreational territory for each 75 people. The city has 17 supervised playgrounds and the cost of maintenance is just two cents per child per day. Dayton shows, in human terms, rather than in financial statistics, what good government means.


What Dayton has enjoyed, and still
