The news points to a sale on any closing bulge, with a dip Thursday on signs of very large late December deliveries. One report covers a possible million or two passed around. About 4,400,000 Canadian wheat is on the way to United States. The talk of a billion dollar credit against export sales meets with little attention, the public will have to subscribe and the plan courts failure. Country still holding corn but less banks take a grain selling attitude.
