

**POSTAL DELEGATES
AT MADRID CONGRESS
FORCE RATE RAISE**

(By Associated Press)
MADRID, Dec. 20.—The slogan of the European delegates to the postal congress held here appeared to be "we want revenue, while that of the delegates from the United States and Latin America was clearly "we seek to exchange public service."

The discussions all through the long committee stages of the congress were tinged with these opposite ideas and led to the formation of two solid blocks among the delegates—the western hemisphere against the eastern. Friendly feeling was not lost at any time, but the determination of the hard-stricken Europeans was backed by their voting power and the new convention of Madrid contains the authorization to raise the postal rates.

Make Separate Contracts.

Like the old convention of Rome, the freshly drafted agreement leaves it open to members of the union to make separate agreements between themselves. Out of this opening arises the Pan-American Postal Union, comprising every republic in Northern, Central and South America, as well as Spain, by which they agree to interchange mutually at domestic rates, all matter, just as though all the countries signing formed a single territory.

The delegates of the European countries and their colonies in their search for revenue seemed to consider it their duty to secure as much for each of their countries as it was possible to extract from the congress.

**Great Britain to Reply
to American Oil Note**

Unofficially officers of the department have been informed that every contention contained in the note prepared by Secretary Colby has been answered.

**France is Suffering
From Cold Wave**

PARIS, Dec. 20.—France is suffering from an unusually severe cold wave, thermometers at Strausburg showing 11 degrees above zero Fahrenheit, while Belfort, Bordeaux and Marseilles report temperatures almost as low. Several canals in the Midi district have been frozen over and snow has caused considerable damage in the region of Nice. In this city the cold has been severe for several days.

SUPPRESS TICKET GAMBLING.

BUENOS AIRES, Dec. 20.—A campaign to suppress speculation in theater tickets has been undertaken in this city. An ordinance has been proposed to prohibit such resale of tickets except under strict regulations.






