

"ROSIE" is apparently a Jewish Rosie, for she is introduced with a familiar "Good-Luck" Jewish phrase and there is a general spirit of "Mazzolot" all through the number. It is full of characteristic dry Jewish humor, and it develops in the middle to a sort of patriarchal desecration. There are one or two remarkable modulations, some fine muted corner effects and an occasional utterance from a special bass clarinet, which seems to go off in a corner and growl by itself. "ROSIE" winds up with a curious "doubling-up" of the beat which will command itself to the less serious sort of fox trotters. "ROSIE" introduces "Tired of Me." "HONOLULU EYES" introduces "I'm in Heaven When I'm in My Mother's Arms," and furthermore it introduces special whistling effects by Miss Margaret McKee, whose trilling sounds as if a whole forestful of birds surrounded the waltzers. For "HONOLULU EYES" is a waltz, and it is well named.
