

FRANCES BURTCH, OF GREENVILLE, EXPIRES; WAS OLD RESIDENT

GREENVILLE, Feb. 28.—The death of Mrs. Frances Levina Burtch, widow of M. W. Burtch, a former pioneer resident of Dawn, occurred at the home of her son-in-law, R. R. Winters, 607 Washington avenue, Saturday after an illness of three days, of heart trouble. Mrs. Burtch was 86 years and 6 months of age at the time of her death, and prior to moving to this city, had resided in the village of Dawn for over fifty years.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. E. E. Niswonger, of Dayton, and Mrs. R. R. Winters, of this city. Funeral services will be held at the Winters home on Washington avenue, Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock, with Rev. Vorhis in charge. Interment in the Beamsville cemetery.




