CHICAGO, April 29.—The rise of May wheat to \$1.32% seems to be accepted calmly. May wheat sold at \$1.30% last Saturday. Liberal corn and oats deliveries are expected next week. Wheat receipts were about a stand-off. Weekly wheat and flour clearances are large at 10,500,000. Wheat prospects hold up good but a little condition loss is expected. Corn and oats for Saturday's session depend on what changing over is still due. We are inclined to expect more covering in May wheat overnight.
