

JOINT CLUB MEETING WILL FOLLOW FORUM WEDNESDAY EVENING

Attendance at the second Chamber of Commerce forum meeting is being urged in cards mailed to members by the secretary-manager. The meeting will be in the Chamber of Commerce assembly room in the K. of P. building, at 7:30 o'clock Wednesday night. Several articles of the 14 points in the program of work adopted at the first meeting have been industriously promoted, and it is expected added impetus to the program activities will result from the meeting Wednesday.

The latter half of the meeting will be given over to a joint meeting of the Rotary club, Kiwanis and Chamber of Commerce, to hear an illustrated talk on "Community Chest," by Elwood Street, secretary, American association of Community Welfare organizations, Louisville, Ky. A joint committee from the three local organizations invited Mr. Street here for the illustrated talk.

Interest in a community chest program for Richmond seems keen, and a large attendance of interested persons is expected. Should a community chest program be adopted, funds would not be raised until fall. Financial aid to worthy civic and benevolent institutions would come from the chest in 1922, instead of numerous separate financial appeals.

INTEREST REVIVED IN HORSESHOE PLAYING

Indorsement of a move to establish horseshoe courts in the parks of Richmond was made by Mayor Zimmerman Monday morning, the movement to be carried on through the park boards and recreational committees of the city.

BERGDOLL'S ATTORNEY GUILTYLESS, WESTCOTT

WASHINGTON, May 23.—A letter from former Judge John W. Westcott, N. J., written to Attorney General Palmer, soon after the escape of Grover Cleveland Bergdoll declared the late D. Clarence Gibboney, Bergdoll's counsel was "innocent as an unborn babe" of complicity in the escape. The communication was placed before the house committee investigating the Bergdoll matter today and urged Mr. Palmer to put a good man on the case to defeat efforts of Philadelphia newspapers to bring about the arrest of Gibboney on charges of conspiracy.


