

RESIDENTS OF EATON WITNESSES IN TRIAL HELD AT ZANESVILLE

EATON, O., June 17—Several Eaton people are witnesses in a \$125,000 damage suit against the Pennsylvania Railway company that is on trial in Zanesville. Ellsworth Raub, of Zanesville, brought the suit. He is suing for damages for alleged permanent injuries sustained when an automobile carrying him and three other Zanesville men was struck by a Pennsylvania train on a crossing, near Eaton, three years ago. One member of the party was killed outright, another died of his injuries and Raub and the other man were injured.




