GRAIN PRICES

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CHICAGO, June 20.—Bullish spring wheat news fell flat. Grain trade oppressed by the heaviness in stocks and cotton. The southwest harvest in full swing and bears figure farmers have only one course open, "to sell." Looks like large July receipts and narrowing of July premium. Export demand poor. The northwest may be losing 10 to 20 million wheat but Canadian acreage large. Cash wheat three to 10 cents lower. There is talk of the southwest having only 10 million wheat sold ahead for export which was an early factor. Corn crop news, wonderfully good and receipts large. Overnight it looks as though the bear news will have to be considered. Five hundred and thirty cars of wheat at Kansas City today.
