

SPIRIT OF LOYALTY, SERVICE, NEEDED IN LIFE TODAY, ORBISON

WILLIAMSBURG, Ind., June 20.—Asserting that one of the greatest needs of the present day community life is the spirit of charity and forbearance for the faults of others, Judge Charles J. Orbison of Indianapolis paid a tribute to the spirit of sacrifice which existed in this country during the world war, in a speech delivered at Williamsburg Sunday afternoon. The address was delivered in connection with the annual Decoration Day services of the Williamsburg Knights of Pythias lodge. William Brown, chancellor commander of the local lodge, introduced the speaker.

"The great purpose of living is to knit this world together so that God may claim his own," said the speaker. Our great job is to work out the salvation of the race, knowing neither rich nor poor. We should join in this movement for what we can put into it, for we can take out of life only what we put into it. It is the un-

selfish man that lives, and he who gives receives."

Greater Loyalty Needed.

We are living in a great day, and the time has come when we must insist, as American citizens, that no other flag than the star spangled banner shall be exalted and honored in this country.

It is the business of every American citizen to insist that all who do not believe in the Constitution shall be removed. This shall be a 100 per cent American institution. We need a militant citizenship, a citizenship that wants to conserve and preserve the union of our forefathers."

Rain, coming at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, broke up the meeting at the school grounds on the outskirts of the town and forced the crowd to take refuge in the Methodist church, where the speech was delivered. Music was furnished by the Williamsburg Saxophone band.

At the close of the services in the church, a concert was given by the band. Miss Marjorie Hollingsworth acted as leader.

NEW ELECTRIC POWER LINE PLANNED FOR TWO OHIO TOWNSHIPS

EATON, O., June 20.—Franchise to erect and maintain an electrical transmission line in Monroe and Harrison townships has been granted by the county commissioners to C. D. Folkerth, E. E. Parks, E. V. Priddy and others, doing business as the Hagerstown Electrical company. The line will furnish current for power and light to farmers.

The line will extend east on the Holtzmueller road, from the Eaton and West Manchester road, to the Monroe and Harrison township line. From Hagerstown it will extend southeast on the Euphemia and Castine road to the Georgetown and Verona road. Branches will reach to the C. E. Davis farm, to Twin Creek chapel and to the J. H. Gruber farm in Harrison township.
