

SEEK TO DETERMINE VALUE OF PROPERTY OWNED BY STANFORD

Mrs. Maude D. Stanford, plaintiff in the divorce suit against Roscoe Stanford, was placed on the stand in Wayne circuit court at 11:30 Thursday morning to testify in her own behalf. The plaintiff related incidents of her married life since their marriage in 1896.

She testified that she had worked in the wheat and hay fields, tended garden, kept chickens, helped with feeding and milking and cooked for hands during their married life.

During two falls Mrs. Stanford stated she had husked corn at the side of her husband, every afternoon, doing her housework in the morning. She further testified that she had sacked corn, wheat and oats and cleaned wheat and oats and tended to her household duties during all this time.

To Show Disposition
The testimony of Mrs. Stanford which was given before the noon recess, was for the purpose of showing her general disposition and helpfulness to her husband. She was questioned regarding the property belonging to the parties and the time of its acquisition.

The house which the family occupied in Boston which was built in 1916 cost between \$11,000 and \$12,000 Mrs. Stanford stated. She said her husband had operated about 320 acres of land since their marriage and characterized him as a hard worker.

Examination to Continue
Examination of Mrs. Stanford probably will continue until late Friday morning. It is expected that court will adjourn Friday noon until Monday morning on an agreement between the attorneys and Judge Bond.

The defendant's father, L. J. Stanford, of Liberty, who has been assisting Attorney Pigman in the defense of his son, was taken ill during the hearing Wednesday afternoon and was unable to appear in court Thursday. He had been ill previous to the starting of the trial and the excitement of the case is thought to have aggravated his condition.

On cross examination Attorney Pigman introduced a will made by Mr. Stanford in 1911, which was witnessed by Mr. Hart, in which Mr. Stanford willed all his property to Mrs. Stanford without equivocation. Mr. Hart stated that he remembered witnessing the instrument but could not remember the contents.

Mr. Hart was allowed to leave the stand, but will be recalled by the defense, according to Mr. Pigman.

An effort was made Wednesday evening to reach an agreement on the value of the property of Mr. Stanford by the attorneys. This was unsuccessful, it was said. Thursday morning the defense was allowed to introduce three prominent farmers from the vicinity of Boston who testified regarding the value of the Stanford farm. Ross Witt, A. D. Mitchell, and Everett Kitchell testified that the 160-acre farm of Stanford was probably worth in the neighborhood of \$125 to \$150 an acre.

Tells of Settlement.
George Hart, an old friend of the family was placed on the stand by the plaintiff. He testified regarding a meeting at his home after the separation of the Stanfords in 1913 at which meeting their difficulties were supposed to have been settled and they were reunited.
