

# BEAUTY CHATS

This is the time of the year when all beauty problems give way before the great one of what to do about freckles and sunburn. Unfortunately, it is a very difficult problem. Some complexions are so sensitive that the hot sun acts almost as a poison, while other skins acquire a healthy tan which lasts far into the winter months.

There are all sorts of prepared lotions that are supposed to act quickly upon sunburn, but these are necessarily very strong, and I hesitate to recommend them. Many complexions cannot stand a strong lotion.

That is why I talk so much about methods of prevention. But if, in spite of your efforts, your skin has acquired too many freckles or a strong coat of tan, I would advise you to choose a slower method of bleaching with some lotion you know to be harmless. Personally, I think cucumber milk is unrivaled for keeping the skin smooth and white. It will bleach freckles and sunburn to a really great extent, and it has the advantage of making the skin fine-grained as well as bleaching it. Indeed, it is very good for the skin. Here is the formula:

**Cucumber Milk.**  
Oil of sweet almonds.....4 ounces  
Fresh cucumber juice.....10 ounces  
Essence of cucumbers.....3 ounces  
White castile soap, powdered 1/2 ounce  
Tincture of benzoin.....2 drachms

The juice of the cucumbers is obtained by slicing them thin, cooking slowly in a little water and straining. Make the essence by putting an ounce and a half of the juice into the same quantity of alcohol. Shake this with the soap in a large jar. When dissolved, add the cucumber juice and, when mixed, add the oil and the benzoin, stirring until the liquid is creamy. Keep in tightly corked bottles in the dark and shake well before using.

M. F. G.—You should be pleased that you have this dimple in your chin and you probably would spoil your appearance if you had it filled out. The color of your lashes will not be improved by dyeing them. They are correct for your type as they are now.

Anxious—Send a stamped, addressed envelope and I will mail you a formula for stopping the excessive perspiration. You did not state what had caused the stains on the face, so it would be impossible to suggest a remedy; almost any drugist can help you in this, but you should know what it was that caused the stains—for instance, acid stains are removed by neutralizing the acid with an alkali, and the other way about.

B. S. B.—Your teeth should be cleaned by a dentist. After that you will be able to keep them looking white yourself. To keep your blonde hair from turning brown, try lemon juice and baking soda in the last rinse water, after the regular shampoo. The proportions are a tablespoonful of juice and one-third of a teaspoonful of soda to two quarts of water. Dry the hair in the sun and go without a hat when convenient.

M. E. B.—You can bleach and clean your panama hat by rubbing into the straw a paste made from flour of sulphur and water. Be generous with this wherever there is an unusually discolored spot. Hang the hat out in the full sunshine, as this with the sulphur does the bleaching. All straw hats of natural color can be restored by this method. A rust spot, which so often happens from the hat wiring,

will bleach out if the spot is kept moistened with lemon juice and sprinkled with salt. The sunshine is needed for this, also.

Hopeful—For your blackheads, try steaming with hot moist cloths, after which use a cleansing cream liberally. Dry the skin and massage into it some fine cold cream until the skin has absorbed all that it will. Remove the surplus and follow this treatment by an ice rub, or you can close the pores with very cold water. If you do this twice each week, even such a stubborn case as yours must show improvement.

Anxious Mother—Give him less food that is starchy, especially potatoes and white bread. As a substitute, Graham or bran bread should be eaten. Be very moderate in serving him desserts that are not only sweet, but starchy. The rich pastry also is very fattening. He can have plenty of fruit except bananas. A boy of 11 years requires plenty of food to keep up his strength, as he is being taxed for growth, so I should not carry his dieting too far, even if he does insist on it.

Veronica—You have developed faster than most girls of your age, but you will not look any older when you are twenty than you do now. Continue to wear your hair in the same simple fashion and do not try to look older than you really are in years.

A. B.—You can positively cure this tendency by taking two yeast cakes each day. I know a number of young men who have not only cleared their skins of pimples, but have improved their health through taking this yeast cure. Take one at night and the other in the morning, dissolved in water.

## Growing Chicks Should Have Green Feed Daily

In addition to furnishing a sufficient quantity and the right kind of feed to make flesh, muscle and bone, and supply energy for the growing chicks, clean, dry quarters, green feed, fresh water and shade should be provided. The coop should be kept clean, which can be facilitated by keeping sand on the floor and raking off the droppings at least twice a week, and oftener, if possible. The roof should be tight so that the house will always be dry. Green feed is very essential for the growing chickens, the ideal condition being to allow them free range on good grass land. Alfalfa makes an ideal range. Where the chickens have to be confined to small yards it is very essential to supply green feed daily. Freshly cut lawn clippings and short pieces of any growing grain crop, such as oats, wheat, or any quick-growing crop, such as rape, make splendid green feed. Where these growing feeds are not available, sprouted oats may be used and will help materially. Where a hen is kept with a brood of chickens and the chickens confined to a small covered pen, move this coop and pen every two or three days to fresh grass and never let the grass be killed or eaten down where the run is placed. Provide fresh, clean water daily and see that the receptacles are thoroughly cleaned and the chickens never without water. The water should be kept in the shade in as cool a place as possible. Using a stone crock for watering fountains will help to keep the water cool. Where the chickens are confined to yards or have free range, shade should be provided. Trees and low shrubs make ideal shade, but if not available a corn patch or rows of sunflowers will help materially. Where no growing crop or trees of any kind are available it will pay to put up an artificial shade, making a framework two or three feet high and covering this with the branches of trees, weeds, straw or any waste material that will furnish shade.

**Keep Two Hens for Each Member of the Family**

The average novice can reasonably expect to get an average of at least ten dozen eggs per hen per year from his small flock in the back yard. On the basis of two hens to each member of the family this will give twenty dozen eggs a year to each person, which amount is about half way between the average of farm and city consumption.

**Bread and Milk Restore Tired Nerves and Muscles**

A good, old-fashioned bowl of bread and milk, says the Dairy Division of the United States Department of Agriculture, is the very best restorative at the end of a hard day's work. On a cold night the bread may be dropped in hot milk, enough to wet it thoroughly, with just a suspicion of salt for flavor. In England's damp climate bread and milk is the first thought after a long tramp or a day in the open. Almost every brain worker, whether student or professor, doctor, preacher, or business man, knows the refreshing tonic of a steaming bowl of bread and milk. Most children like it, and nothing could be better for them at bedtime or for lunch. When the older ones eat precooked crisp breakfast food, baby may have bread and milk for a change. It is a good emergency supper, too, for the younger ones, when there is not time for thorough cooking of wheat or oatmeal cereal.

**Timely Tips**

## TIMELY HINTS

Make plantings of vegetables for early fall use. Another planting of gladiolus bulbs may be made now to advantage.

Swiss chard is a good leaf vegetable for warm weather. It is also an excellent plant to use for a green food for chickens.

If your tomato plants are cut off near the ground during the night, you can blame the cutworms. Paper collars may be placed around a small number of plants or poisoned bran used for large gardens. Boards placed about the garden will attract the cutworm, which may be found hiding under them during the daytime.

If your grape leaves are punctured with holes, look for the young grapevine flea beetle. If in doubt, spray anyhow with arsenate of lead, one ounce to two gallons of water, to which a little dissolved soap has been added to make it stick. Spray again in two weeks.

Do not cut asparagus after June 20 if you expect to keep up the quality of your asparagus bed. Fertilize the bed well with rotted horse manure and cultivate thoroughly until the plants get too thick to go through easily. Asparagus stores up in the buds and roots the energy for next season's growth.

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## Don't Let Your Garden Quit

Ground Should Be Kept Busy All Spring and Summer

Most crops mature in a shorter period in the late summer than in the spring. This is due to the shortening of the days and the tendency of the plant to "hurry up" to produce its seed before winter overtakes it. It pays to take a chance on late plantings of beets, carrots, lettuce, spinach, snap beans, sweet corn and turnips if you like them.

As a rule early or quick maturing varieties are best for late planting. This does not apply, however, to Golden Bantam corn which does best in the spring. Evergreen or Mammoth Evergreen corn are considered best for late planting.

**A Few Tricks Worth Learning**  
Plenty of fertility in the soil and a little commercial fertilizer will help greatly to push the late crops to maturity. In some sections a little nitrate of soda is used as a top dressing to hurry the plants along.

There are a great many little tricks that should be learned and practiced by the gardener. It is not necessary to be a wizard to practice these tricks but just a good common sense gardener. One of the best of these is the use of a board laid over the row of seeds for a few days after planting to hold the moisture and make the seeds start during dry weather. Another is to flood the furrow with water and allow it to soak into the soil before dropping the seeds, then cover with dry earth. Slightly packing or firming the dry soil over the seeds will help to bring the moisture to the surface and make the seeds grow.
