Housewives and persons interested in cooking are invited to attend the demonstrations, which will be held from 2 to 4:30 o'clock in the Coliseum. The instructors will make the entire demonstration practical and useful. In order that the individual problems of housewives may be solved, they have arranged a question box in which questions may be dropped. The instructors will gladly answer them, as well as any questions that may be put to them.

Miss Brumstead is a graduate of the Thomas Domestic Normal school and has lectured before many colleges and high schools in the Middle West, and Miss Denchie is from the Indiana State Normal school.

Their course of demonstrations will offer many practical methods and suggestions as to the preparation of foodstuffs, all of which is intended to appeal to women and girls who are interested in the preparation of food. One of the features in this connection will be lesson in preparing home-made candies.

PRESENT HOUR GIVES YOUTH ITS CHANCE, SAYS INDIANA WOMAN

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Oct. 24.—The present hour presents to the young people of America an opportunity of unusual significance—of significance, first, to their own lives, in its opportunity for self-development and self-expression; second, in relation to the community, national and world problems. Mrs. Daniel Stecker, of Gary, Ind., told the Woman's Home Missionary society of the Methodist Episcopal church here today.

"The first demand is for fuller knowledge and clear thinking in order to understand the present world conditions and their own relations to them," Mrs. Stecker said. "The second is for resolute decision, implying recognition and assumption of obligation for answering the call for world service—world service, because the day of 'hermit' nations is past, and because for good or ill, the United States has been thrust into economic, social, moral and religious leadership."

"The third demand is for unselfish devotion—the losing of selfish interests and purposes in the larger life of the community, nation and world."

The world-citizen may reside anywhere—in a New England village, a rural community, a western plain, the slums of the city or its finest street. He may work in field, or factory, or office, or store, or school—this does not matter. It is his mental and spiritual contact that make him a world-citizen.

"The field of his world-service may lie just in front of his open door. This is true for most of us. The commission to leave houses and lands, father and mother and to go, comes from within."

Pearls Originally Thought To Be Frozen Dew Drops

The earliest theory of the production of pearls was that they were congealed dew-drops. Another notion was that pearls were eggs of oysters. The Chinese solved the problem and found that pearls are due to the irritation produced by the introduction of a foreign matter, such as a grain of sand, into the shell of the oyster. This bit of matter is coated by the oyster with nacre like that with which the shell is lined, and the result is a pearl.

The Chinese and Japanese carry on the artificial production of pearls to a considerable extent. The shells of the bivalve are separated gently and a small bit of mud or a tiny piece of lead is inserted under the flesh to serve as a nucleus for the pearl. The shell then closes and the oyster is placed carefully in a stream of water and fed on manure. After an interval of four years the shells are opened and the nuclei, coated with nacre, are removed. Pearls produced in this way are genuine and wholly natural. The process is started artificially, but is carried on by the oyster in a strictly normal and natural manner.

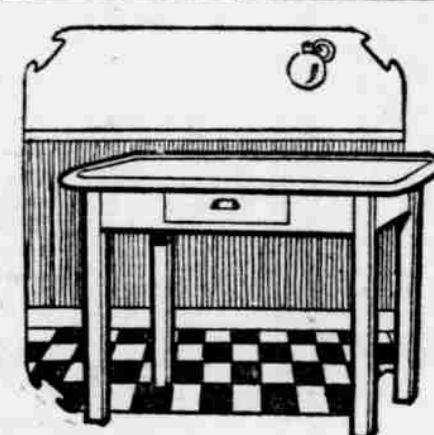

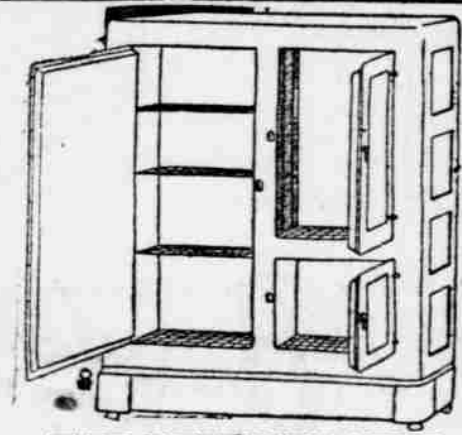
