## CHILE NOT TO REPLY TO PERUVIAN NOTE

(By Associated Press)

SANTIAGO, Chile, Jan. 5.—A cabinet council has decided that no answer will be sent to the latest Peruvian note in regards to the dispute over the provinces of Tacna and Arica.

The latest Peruvian note to Chile received in Santiago, Jan. 1, renewed demands that the Tacna-Arica controversy be submitted to arbitration. It insisted that an arbitrator should decide whether the treaty of Ancón signed in 1883, under which Chile took jurisdiction over the two provinces, had been violated, and how such violations might be repaired.

Chile had previously declared a further exchange of notes useless, stating that she had gone the limit in seeking an agreement.

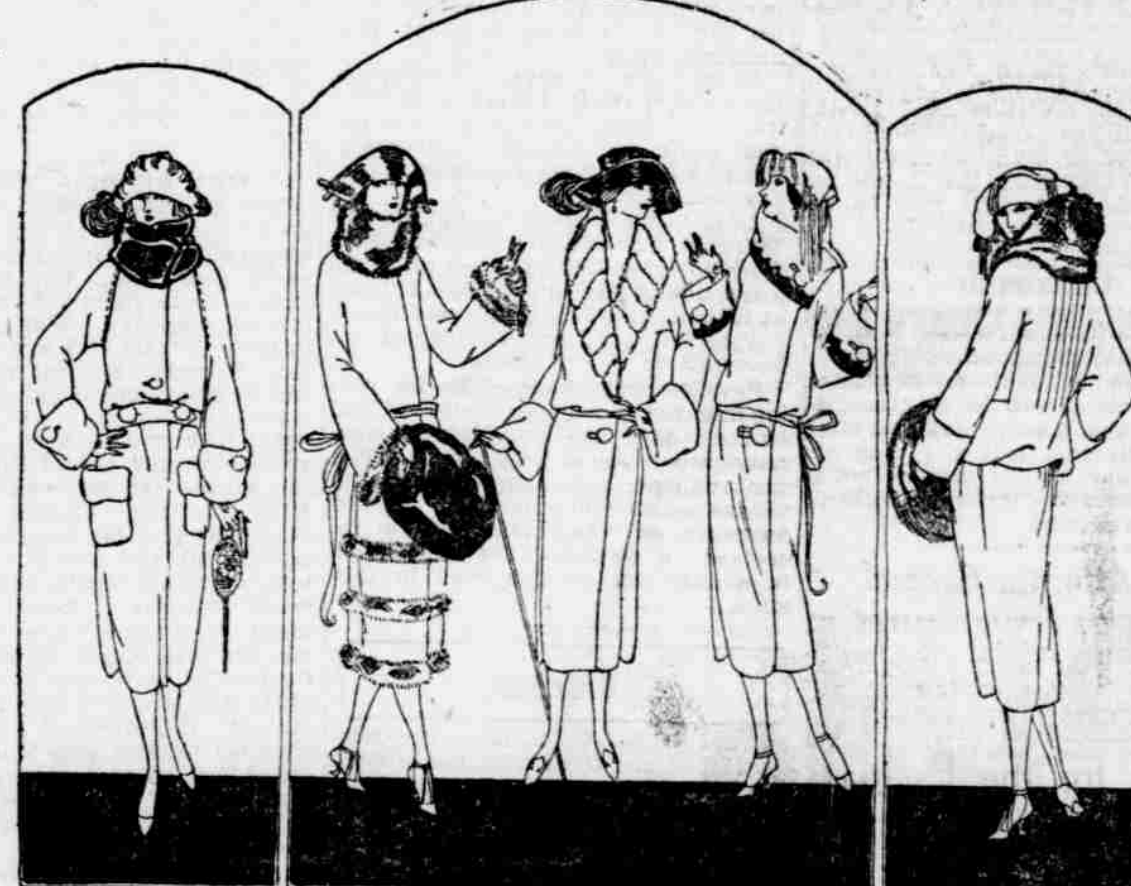
