CHICAGO, Jan. 9.—Wheat was quiet today, within a range of about a cent. Election of officers of the board was on and the crowd was more interested in politics than in the business. The most potent factor of the day, perhaps, was the lack of buying support. Trade, however, was so small that the market sagged of its own weight, prices having no resiliency. Although the visible supply showed a good decrease, the market continued weak. Scattered selling was evident on every little rally.

Locals were moderate sellers of corn today and there was some hedging by receiving houses. Trade was very limited and prices generally followed wheat. Receipts large at 750 cars. Country offerings to arrive light.
