

## ROAD, TAX INQUIRY WILL BE TAKEN UP BY PREBLE FARMERS

EATON, Ohio, Jan. 9.—Support of the newly formed county egg shipping association, and its incorporation as an integral part of the county farm bureau, with expense for its start to be paid by the bureau, and a decision to request a meeting with the county authorities in order to get an understanding as to the probable taxes and their expenditure next year, together with an inquiry as to road building in the county, were the two most important matters considered at the regular meeting of directors of the Preble county farm bureau in Eaton Saturday.

Other matters accomplished by the board included a recommendation that every township send a representative to state farmers' week at Columbus, when several farm bureau speakers and marketing authorities will be heard, a decision to hold a county meeting within a month, and to conduct a campaign for memberships in the Miami Valley Milk Producers company, a co-operative milk marketing company. Explanation of the reasons for the telephone fight in Eaton and surrounding country was given also by Jesse Sherer after permission for his appearance had been granted by the board.

**Explain Organization**  
Avon Zellers of Lewisburg, with Paul McPherson of New Paris, were present to explain the organization of the egg shippers, and its proposed status as a branch of the farm bureau. E. D. Truener, Avon Zellers and Hugh Mitchell were appointed as a committee to investigate and to recommend action for the next meeting.

The question of organization of the milk producers in Preble county was referred to E. M. Brown of Gratiot for action, with instructions to invite the state organizer to the county and accompany him on visits to the various townships, expenses to be borne by the farm bureau. Operation of the Miami Valley producers' association waits only upon organization of Preble county now, it was stated.

## ENGINEERS' SOCIETY HONORS DELL DAVIS

City Engineer D. B. Davis, has been appointed chairman of one of the most important committees of the American Society for Municipal Improvements—that on broken stone and gravel roads. In making this appointment this society, which includes the leading engineers and other municipal officials of the United States and of Canada, recognizes the work which Mr. Davis has done in investigating this subject and his ability as an engineer.

The American Society of Municipal Improvements is a national organization whose members are found in the city halls of the larger cities, and most of the smaller ones also, of all the states of the union and is the only national society that focuses its attention on municipal public works. Appointments to office in this society are recognized as the highest honors that can be conferred upon municipal officials.

**BODIES OF TWO OTHER MISSING BOYS FOUND**  
EVANSVILLE, Ind., Jan. 9.—The bodies of Leo Winiger, 18 years old, and Thomas B. Fruchte, 15 years old, who with Clyde Crow, 18 years old, were drowned in the back water of the Ohio river a short distance above this city a week ago Saturday, were found Sunday near the spot where the body of Crow was discovered Saturday. The bodies were found by farmers who had been searching over the ground, recently submerged on horseback.

## 22 INDIANA CITIES ENTERTAIN TOURISTS; MENTION RICHMOND

INDIANAPOLIS, Jan. 9.—Twenty-two Indiana cities and towns have notified Richard Lieber, director of the state conservation department, that camp sites for entertaining tourists have been established in or adjacent to their municipalities, and in the opinion of conservation officials these increased facilities for caring for automobile travelers will this year attract an augmented number of tourists to our state.

The information comes in response to questionnaires recently sent all Indiana mayors by the conservation department, which is desirous of exploiting Hoosier beauty spots to out-state and transcontinental travelers. Investigations conducted by Mr. Lieber and assistants show that no state in the union is better prepared to bid for the tourist travel than Indiana. In fact, every portion of the commonwealth offers rare attractions in the form of scenic and historic spots, and these native shrines stretch from the hill country to the south to the wonderful lakes and sand wastes bordering the majestic Lake Michigan.

Tourist camp sites are a great asset to any community, Mr. Lieber contends, and at his suggestion several cities which heretofore neglected this business are preparing to take advantage of the increased prosperity possible through automobile travel. These camps, Mr. Lieber says, will provide parking facilities, sites for camp fires, and some will be equipped with commissaries and first aid stations for machines.

Among the cities which already have tourist camps are: Wolcott, Batesville, Crawfordsville, Columbus, Midlefork

(Clinton county), Scottsburg, Bonaville, Rockville, Pendleton, Indianapolis, Covington, Richmond, Lebanon, Goschen, Franklin, Delphi, Plymouth, Portland, Wolf Lake, Oxford, Chubbuck and Corydon.

The conservation department will after all cities report, issue maps for free distribution, showing cities possessing such camps, list of conveniences obtainable at each, together with data on the more scenic routes, chief places of interest, et cetera.

Approximately \$20,000,000 a year already comes to Indiana through the tourist trade, Mr. Lieber points out, and with proper facilities at hand

there is no reason why this amount cannot be doubled, it is believed.
