

IDENTITY OF ALLEGED FORGER AT EATON VERIFIED BY POLICE

EATON, Ohio, Jan. 18.—That Clyde J. West is the right name of the young man held here for forgery and that his home is in Hamilton, has been learned by Chief of Police Willard Armstrong from police in Hamilton, who say they have no charges against West and that they had informed his father of the arrest and that he stated his father did nothing in the matter.

When West tried to pass an alleged spurious check here last Saturday night at the general store of Spring Brothers company, he was arrested. The check was for \$35.50, drawn in favor of Paul J. White, and so indorsed, and bore the name of John O'Day as maker.

It is presumed the intention was to forge the name of John O'Day, farmer, of near New Paris, to the check. Chief Armstrong is of the opinion that West has put out a lot of bad paper under such aliases as Paul J. White, E. C. Petry and Kenneth, Pursley. West is about 20 years old.

Hold Examination.


