

CASE DISMISSED IN WINCHESTER COURT BY JUDGE A. L. BALES

WINCHESTER, Ind., Jan. 28.—The trial of the state ex rel Beatrice Patterson vs. Arthur Zimmerman, on statutory charges, ended Thursday when the prosecuting attorneys filed a motion to dismiss the case. They stated it was not only their wish, but also that of the relatrix to have the trial discontinued. Judge A. L. Bales sustained the motion, dismissed the jury and discharged the defendant.

The sole purpose of these arrangements is to assure protection and efficiency in administration that every cent shall do its utmost in saving life—that the whole effort shall be American in name and ideals. I trust that you will have the support the cause deserves."

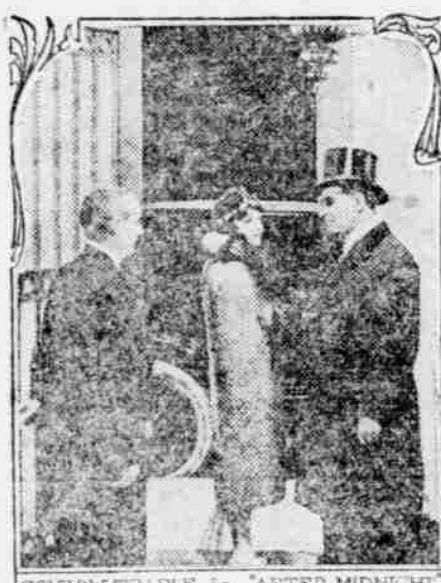

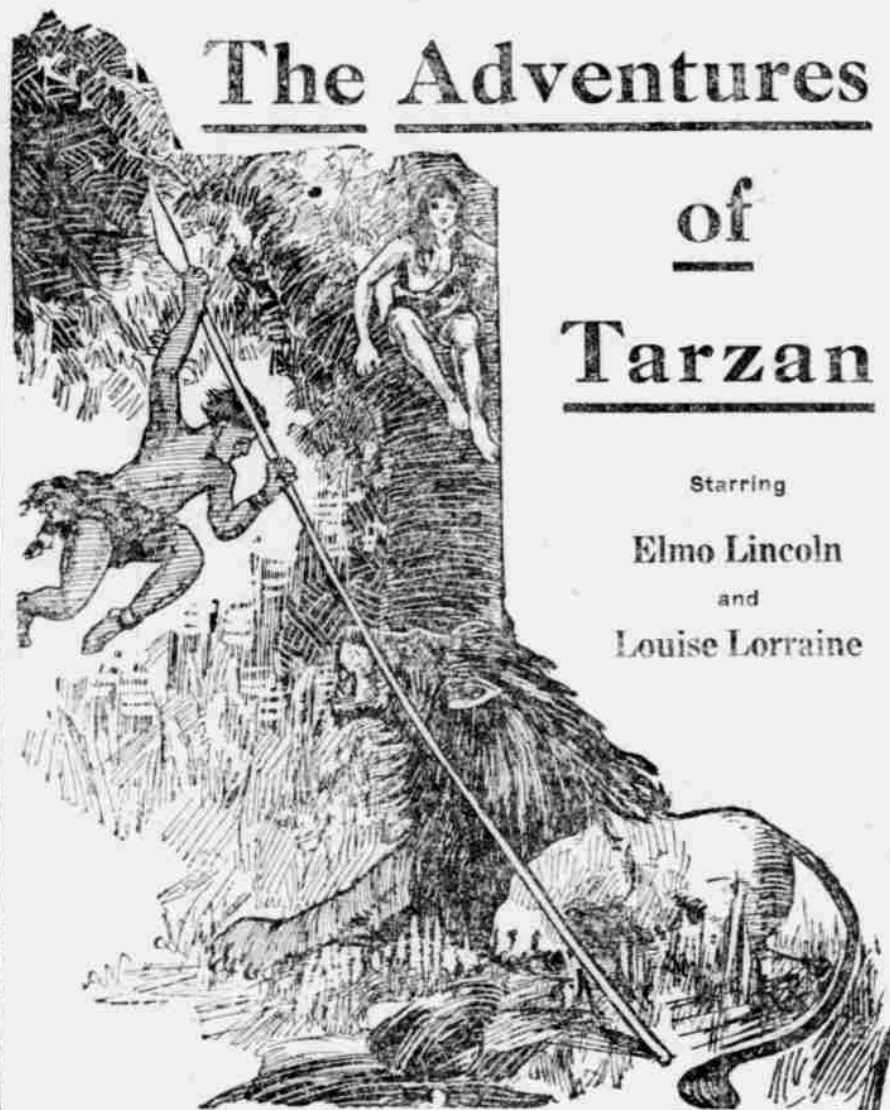
