### HOME BLOWN UP, ELEVEN ARE HURLED FROM BEDS

Discharged Mine Employees Suspected of Dynamiting Residence of Superintendent.

COLLINSVILLE, Ill., Oct. 12.—The home of William F. Scully, superintendent for the Lumbago Coal Co. of St. Louis, was partly wrecked and its 11 sleeping occupants hurled from their beds by two violent explosions, supposedly of dynamite bombs, last midnight.

Asleep in the house at the time were Scully, his wife, their five daughters, three sons and a niece.

The detonation awoke virtually the entire city and after conferring with the mine superintendent the police telephoned to Springfield for bloodhounds and began search for a discharged employee with whom Scully had had a controversy last Saturday.
