LASALLE THEATER.

SEVEN MINUTE SERMON

ON THE GOLDEN TEXT

BY OUR OWN PREACHER

Lesson: In the Garden of Gethsemane. Mark 14:32-42.
Golden Text: Watch, and pray, that ye enter not into temptation. Matt. 26:41.

COMMON TEMPTATIONS.

1. We are tempted to let the flesh control the spirit. The experience of Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane makes the most pathetic reading in all literature. He was then wrestling with all the forces of evil. The great work which he had undertaken and the tragedy of the cross, which he was then facing, culminated in his soul at that moment. He was strongly tempted to give up the fight, and this was the battle which he was then waging, and in which he was victorious. Nearly all men have their Gethsemane! The gardens of suffering, in connection with the average human life, are plentiful enough, but there is generally some agonizing epoch through which we pass which resembles the garden of Gethsemane. We are tempted to let fleshly, or earthly, things control us. The present struggles with the future, the flesh lusteth against the spirit; time wages a war with eternity, and the battle is terrific. If, in this our time of need, we have prayed as Jesus prayed we have had the same victory as Jesus had; but we have allowed ourselves to be indifferent to the important matters confronting us, and have slept at our post, as the disciples did, whom Jesus took into the garden to watch with him, we have been overcome with the tempter, and have lost a great battle. If, on the other hand, we have not permitted the flesh to control the spirit but have been prayerful and resolute, in resisting our temptations we have won a victory with eternally blessed consequences.

2. We are tempted to avoid suffering when that is essential to success. We read in an old hymn that, "This vain world is no friend to grace to help us on to God," and elsewhere, "Sure I must fight if I would win, increase my courage Lord." Paul in writing to the Ephesians urges them, to "Put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wickedness of the devil, for we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places," and much to the same effect is contained in the scriptures warning us against the temptations, and other suffering, which are essential, if we would "fight the good fight of faith and lay hold upon eternal life." It is natural for the flesh to dread suffering and when our courage is below par we seek to avoid it. This desire however, to dodge righteous suffering, if we yield to it, will cause us by and by, first to fight with indifference, and then to turn our back upon the enemy and run. This means of course spiritual defeat, from which so many never recover.

3. We are tempted to live at ease. We live in a friendly country, and if there were no enemies to God, nor if mankind, if there were no evil forces to overcome, if there were no devil to fight, and no moral victory

to win, there may be some excuse in living an easy, indifferent life. But surrounded as we are with so much evil, and confronted with so many forces of a vicious character, it is impossible for us to be on God's side, and at the same time sleep at our posts, or live an indifferent life. When Jesus, whose army we have joined, is fighting these forces of evil it is criminal for us to be indifferent. Our lesson story gives the information that when Jesus entered upon the terrible struggle in Gethsemane, that he requested his three favorite disciples to stay at a little distance and to watch with him, but when he came back to them, apparently for a little sympathy, they were asleep. He went away again and renewed the struggle, and then came back to them the second time, and still found them asleep, and this he repeated for a third time, and found them sleeping still.

4. Let us therefore watch and pray that we may be strong and faithful. If Peter, and James, and John had been as spiritual at that time, as they were afterwards, they would not have slept when their master was in a death struggle with the enemy. What a lesson this is to us, in watching and praying against our natural love of ease, and against any lapse of duty, or indifference to the cause of the kingdom of heaven on earth. It is necessary for us to keep on the alert, and to watch and pray that we do not yield to the temptations of the flesh as these disciples did. Alas! we are all prone to do this, and our only safety in overcoming this temptation, is to be constant in prayer, and fervent in our supplications that we may be able to stand in the day of temptation; that we may never forsake our post, or turn our back to the enemy, or in any way hinder, or disgrace, the cause of regular duty, or master. There is so much work to be done, so many evils to overcome, so many foes to vanquish, so much indifference to dissipate, so many sinners to save, that it becomes us to be faithful, to watch, and work, and pray, that we may be brave and successful soldiers of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Then, by and by, we shall enter into our reward and receive the well done good and faithful servant from our master.
