

LOGANSPOUT BOY SLAIN IN ACTION

Five Americans Killed and
Five are Wounded
in Battle.

WASHINGTON, March 4. — Five Americans, including Private Harry J. Henry of Logansport, Ind., were killed, five were severely wounded and four slightly wounded in the fight with the Germans north of Toul, the war department announced today. Those killed besides Henry were Second Lieut. Harold F. Badie, of Tilton, N. H.; Sergt. Anthony Amodio, Baltimore; Privates Edgar Parsons, Okids, N. C., and Matthew Brew, Fayette, N. D.

The department also announced the following killed in action: Sergt. Joseph P. Chalmers, Derby, Me., Feb. 21; Corp. Eph Bogges, Red Jacket, W. Va., March 2.

Private Hugh Weatherman, Beauman, Ind., March —, and Cook Thomas S. Hardesty, El Paso, Feb. 28.

Those severely wounded March 1 were: Corp. Elliott Fortner, Herrin, Ill.; Privates Isaac Howard, Evans, Ky.; Roy R. News, Jr., D. No. 2, Duluth, Minn., and Ruben J. Finkle, Highland, Mont., and Cook Glen H. Work, Overt, Neb.

Those slightly wounded March 1 were: Corp. John B. Little, Abbott, Ark.; Privates John MacRae, Jr., Chicago; Arthur E. Nelson, Cambridge, Ill., and Edward J. Turner, Lake Mills, Ia.

The following were slightly wounded on other dates: Sergt. William J. Sproule, Newark, Me., Feb. 22; Corp. Sam Thames, Bucatunna, Miss., Feb. 26; Privates Harry M. Nightengale, Rumford, Me., Feb. 22; Leslie M. Talbot, Arlington, Mass., Feb. 23; and Charles L. Linton, Downey, Ida., Feb. 26.

The department announced that Private Robert R. Bayard, Dedham, Mass., died Feb. 9, and Corp. John J. Crowley, Wakefield, Mass., Feb. 14, from wounds.

Deaths from disease among the American soldiers in Europe were reported today as follows:

FOOTBALL MAN KILLED. RED CROSS FOOD FOR POOR PARIS CHILDREN

PARIS, Saturday, March 2. — One hundred children of the overcrowded southeast corner of Paris received their first taste of American Red Cross food today in the form of scientifically prepared, sweetened rolls made of flour, rice, milk and sugar. There also was a substantial bar of chocolate for each of the little ones.

Doctors of the children's bureau working in Red Cross dispensaries had found that the children, who included many repatriated from the north, were suffering often from proper food nourishment than from illness. They decided, therefore, to make this addition to the daily food which replaces the slice of bread and a piece of chocolate which were traditionally given to French children at four o'clock in the afternoon. Since the war began this old custom has been abandoned and the children also suffered through missing a hot midday meal because of their mothers absence in munitions factories.

Red Cross workers visited four schools on the first day of the distribution. The schools were decorated with American flags and posters told the children the new food came from America. The pupils in one school sang the Star Spangled Banner in French while 75 girls in another school sang two verses in English.

The distribution of the rolls will be made in other sections through the school canteens.

LOOK FOR MAN WHO MADE PRO-GERMAN REMARKS

CANTON, O., March 4. — "You guys will all be taking your hats off to the Kaiser in a month!"

Before the crowd of 40 workmen whom he had shouted the remark, could reach him, Harry Rogalski, a former employee of the Canton Drop Forge Co., last night disappeared.

The men waited at the office of the cashier for the supporter of the Kaiser to call for his pay envelope. When he appeared, every workman in the plant quit work, and reinforced by hundreds of persons, escorted Rogalski to the public square, where he was made to kiss the American flag. After the ceremony he was turned over to the police, who marched with their prisoner draped in the flag to the jail, followed by the crowd. He will be tried on a charge of uttering pro-German remarks, the federal authorities said.
