

STARS OF STAGE PICKET THEATERS ON BROADWAY

Actors' Strike Takes on Regular Labor Tinge—Chorus Gets Chance.

By United Press: NEW YORK, Aug. 9.—Both actors and managers were rehearsing their casts today for the third act of the Broadway drama "The Great Strike."

Hainbridge Colby, attorney for the managers, had been instructed to bring suit against the Actors' Equity association and every individual actor who had violated his contract by striking. The association announced today that 666 new applications for membership had been received by the "union."

They also expressed jubilation over the report that 30 rehearsals of coming productions had been called off. The number of dark theaters, however, had decreased from 12 to 9 last night, despite picketing by the strikers.

Pickets at the Ziegfeld Follies attracted swarms of chorus girls to the fire escapes. It took five policemen to move the crowd.

One gathering of actors on the street resulted in the arrest of eight performers, giving the strike a regulation labor complexion.

Playwrights and managers "doubled in brass" last night, filling parts made vacant by the strike. Understudios were given an opportunity of a lifetime and in one musical show the places of seven principals were filled by men and women from the chorus.

E. H. Sothern resigned from the actors' "union" announcing he was "not in accord with their procedure."

Insert Clause To Protect Oil Men of U. S.

By United Press: WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—A reservation to the Colombian treaty has been decided upon by the senate foreign relations committee to prevent the Colombian government enforcing a recent decree which American oil men declare would result in confiscation of their property there.

A sub-committee, headed by Sen. Fall, New Mexico, met today to draw up the reservation. It had before it a copy of a decree recently issued by Pres. Suarez of Colombia, nationalizing petroleum deposits and prohibiting surface owners from negotiating oil leases.

TEST VALIDITY OF NEW STATE TAX STATUTE

U. S. WILL SEIZE HOARDED FOOD

Will Help Reestablish Operation of Law of Supply and Demand.

By United Press: WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—Hoarded food stocks will be taken over by the government and placed upon the market to help reestablish the operation of the law of supply and demand, the department of justice made known today.

Preparations for this work are now well under way as part of Atty. Gen. Palmer's country-wide campaign against profiteers.

Palmer today was hourly expecting news of arrests from district attorneys who have been flooding him with telegrams concerning evidence they are collecting.

Several government departments are understood to be

working together in checking the stores of hoarded foods. The belief exists here that it will not be difficult to get these supplies on the market, as after the department of justice, by legal process, has opened a number of warehouses, with full publicity, owners of other hoards will probably hasten to sell to avoid prosecution and exposure.

While evidence is being put in shape for presentation to the Chicago federal grand jury in support of the charge that big packers have violated anti-trust laws, government experts are "preparing cases" to be submitted to their grand juries.

NEW YORK, Aug. 9.—Eight thousand painters, decorators and paper-hangers will strike here Aug. 15, unless their demands are met, union officials said today. The men ask \$1 an hour for an eight hour day and a five day week.

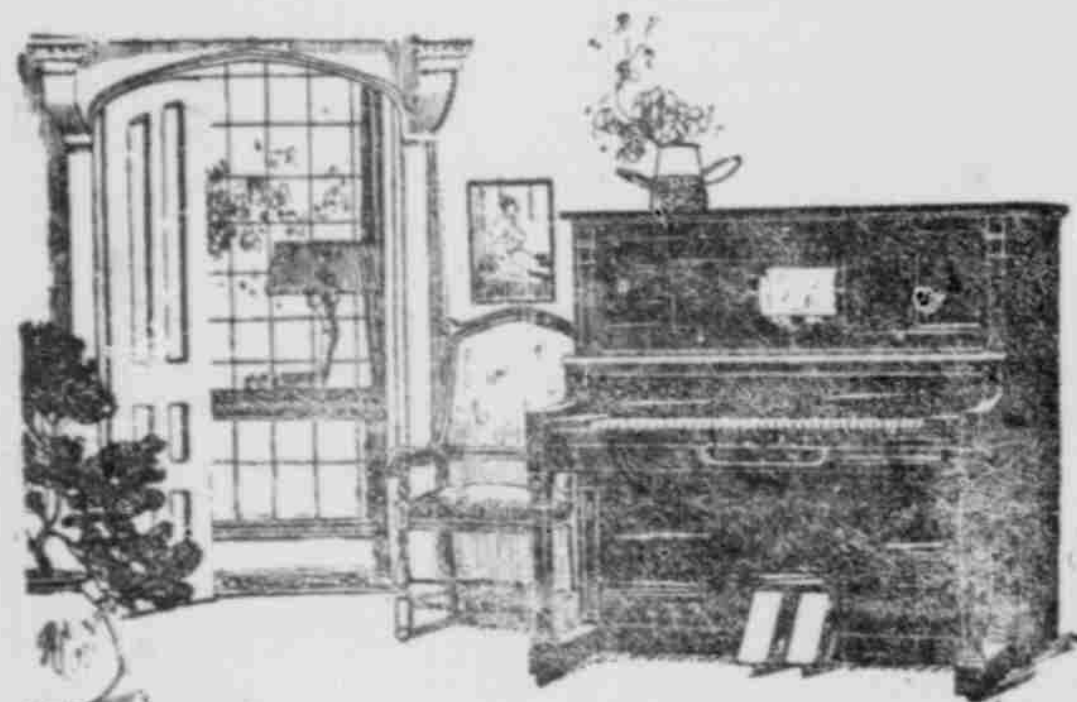

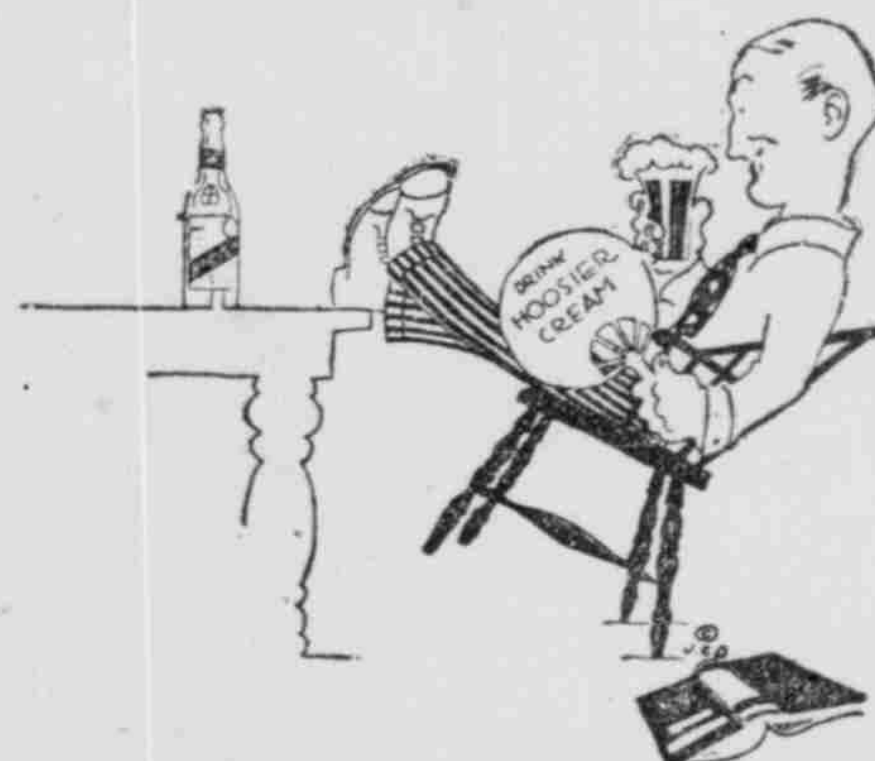

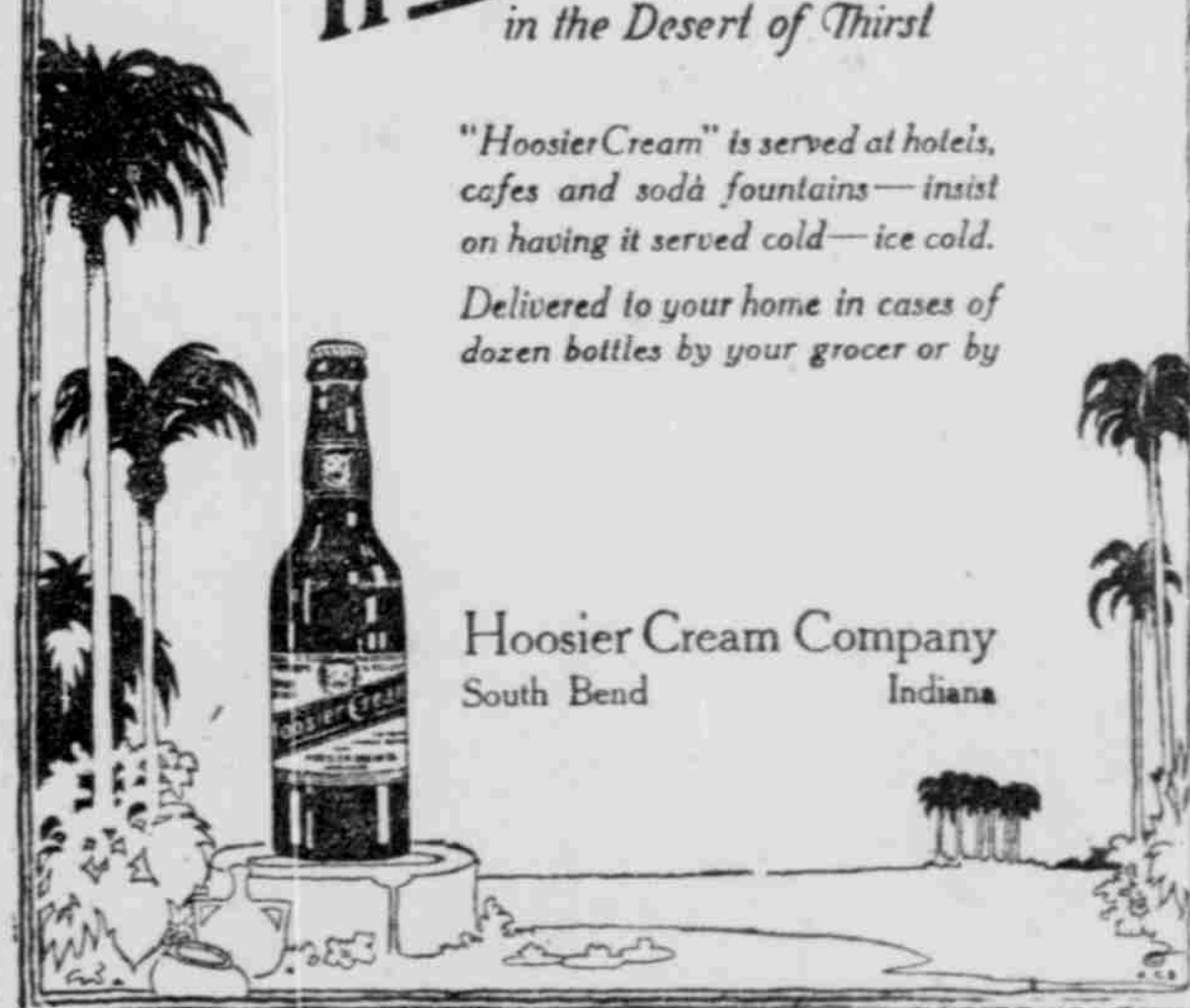
