

CULVER CADETS HAVE BIG TIME AT EXHIBITION

People Pack Grand Stand at
Springbrook Park to See
Black Horse Troop.

With gaiety and action at high tide and the strains of music from a 45-piece band, the Culver Military cadets gave a military exhibition on the race track at Springbrook park Thursday afternoon before a crowd of over 10,000 people. The grand stand and ground surrounding the track was filled with people eager to see the stunts which were promised by the troop.

Well trained boys and intelligent horses did practically every stunt known to the profession of horsemanship. With horses running at full speed, the boys mounted and dismounted like veterans. The pyramid stunt, comprised of eight boys stacked on three horses, won the admiration and applause of the vast crowd of spectators.

Parade in Morning

Activities of the day started early in the morning with a parade through the uptown streets, headed by the naval band of the academy which arrived in South Bend at 9:30 o'clock from Culver. The parade started from South and Michigan sts. at 10 o'clock.

After the band left the cavalry cadets at St. Joseph and Jefferson blvd., they were escorted by members of the Retail Merchants' association to the Oliver hotel, where they gave a concert prior to being entertained at a noon luncheon by the Kiwanis club.

During the performance at Springbrook park Thursday afternoon Col. L. R. Gignillat, commandant at the academy, arrived to review the drills.

In the evening Col. L. R. Gignillat accompanied the boys of the troop and band to the South Bend Country club at the Chain-O-Lakes where they were entertained during the evening with dancing and concerts by the academy band.

The cadets left this morning for Eagle lake where they will remain for the night, after which they will journey to Elkhart and back to Culver. Elkhart is planning a big celebration for the reception of the troop there. The band which is not traveling with the members of the Black Horse troop, will be sent to Elkhart to participate in the celebration at that place.

TO SELL ARMY BLANKETS HERE

South Bend to Receive Quota
for Disposition Through
Parcel Post.

South Bend will soon have its quota of surplus commercial blankets that the war department is putting on sale at storage points throughout the United States. Approximately 2,000,000 blankets, all-wool and cotton and wool, will be disposed of through the parcel post by the postmasters. The goods will be ready for shipment about the 18th of August, according to advices received from the war department.

Reclaimed blankets which have been slightly worn will be sold with the blankets that have never been issued. The reclaimed blankets have

been completely renovated and laundered and having, in a majority of instances, been used less than a year, are but slightly worn. The report to the local postmaster says:

The prices fixed are materially lower than those at which similar commercial blankets are selling in the retail market. The blankets offered are single-width blankets. The average size is 54 by 74 inches, but some of the stock measures 50 by 70 inches. The average weight of the all-wool and wool-and-cotton blankets is four pounds and of the cotton blankets three pounds.

Not having the retail mercantile machinery required for the making of sales in less than bale lots, the war department will sell to municipalities in bale lots of similar grade for re-sale to their residents at prices which, with transportation costs and other expenses of handling which must be borne by the municipality included, should not exceed the following quotations: All-wool, new \$6; reclaimed \$5; cotton-and-wool, mixed, new \$5; reclaimed \$3.50; all-cotton, new \$3; reclaimed \$1.25. The municipality will be given 10 days after receipt of goods in which to make payment.
