

AMERICAN TROOPS GET HIGH HONORS

Twenty-eighth Infantry Get to
Wear French Fouragere
With Croix de Guerre.

With The American Forces In
Germany, Aug. 15.—Decorations be-
stowed recently upon the 28th in-
fantry, first division, by Marshal Pe-
tain included the second regi-
ment of the Croix de Guerre with
palm which, in the French army,
entitles the officers and men of the
regiment to wear the fouragere.

American officers say they believe
it quite probable that authority for
the unit to wear the shoulder cord
will be forthcoming from Wash-
ington in the near future.

All infantry regiments of the first
division have now received the Croix
de Guerre with palm.

de Guerre with palm, the 16th and
the 26th infantry being decorated
this week at ceremonies in Coblenz.
The 18th infantry received the award
some time ago.

Three Regiments Cited.

The 16th, 18th and 26th field ar-
tillery regiments of the third divi-
sion also received from Marshal Pe-
tain collective citations amounting
to the decoration of the colors
of those regiments with the Croix
de Guerre with gold star. The regi-
mental colors were not available for
the occasion as they had not been
brought back from Paris where they
were used in the victory parade on
July 14.

At the ceremonies in Coblenz the
highest award of commander of the
legion of honor was received from
Marshal Petain by Maj.-Gen. Edward
T. McGlinchlin, formerly acting com-
mander of the American forces in
Germany; and Brig.-Gen. Frank E.
Bamford of the first division. The
title of officer of the legion of honor
was also bestowed upon Maj.-Gen.
Robert L. Howze, Brig.-Gen. Fred
W. Sladen, Col. Halstead Dorey and
Col. Frank J. Morrow, all of the
third division.
